- (4) By December 1, 2010, the department shall establish guidelines for the program, including schedules and procedures for applicants to follow in applying for a rebate and criteria for the department to follow in prioritizing and awarding rebates.
- Section 2. For the 2010-2011 fiscal year, the sum of \$100,000 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Environmental Protection for the purpose of administering the water-efficient appliance rebate program. However, the appropriated funds may not be released to the department until it submits a report to the Legislative Budget Commission certifying that:
- (1) The water-efficient appliance rebate program complies with 42 U.S.C. s. 15821 and any subsequent implementing federal regulations; and
- (2) The state will receive funds under 42 U.S.C. s. 15821 and the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 to implement the water-efficient appliance rebate program.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
