Section 2. Present subsections (2) through (6) of section 817.36, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (3) through (7), respectively, and a new subsection (2) is added to that section, to read:

817.36 Resale of tickets.-

(2) Notwithstanding the limitations on the resale of tickets provided in subsection (1), a ticket seller may not prohibit or restrict the resale or offering for resale of a 13

ticket by a lawful possessor of such ticket by:

- (a) Imposing licensure or contractual terms on the initial sale of such ticket, including, but not limited to, terms printed on the back of the ticket which prohibit the resale of the ticket or restrict the price or other terms and conditions under which a ticket may be resold.
- (b) Requiring the purchaser of a ticket, whether for a single event or for a series or season of events, to agree not to resell the ticket, or to resell the ticket only through a specific channel approved by the ticket seller.
- (c) Bringing legal action, based on an unlawful prohibition or restriction on the resale of a ticket, against:
- 1. A purchaser who resells or offers to resell a ticket without the permission of the ticket seller, or in violation of a restriction imposed by the ticket seller;
- 2. Persons who facilitate or provide services for the resale of tickets without such permission or in alleged violation of such restriction; or
- 3. The operator of a physical or electronic marketplace in which a ticket is offered for resale without such permission or in alleged violation of such restriction.
- (d) Imposing a penalty on a ticket purchaser who resells or offers to resell a ticket without permission or in violation of a restriction imposed by the ticket seller, or treating such purchaser in any material way less favorably than a similarly situated purchaser who does not resell or offer to resell a ticket, or who complies with resale restrictions imposed by the ticket seller.
  - (e) Employing technological means for the purpose or with



the foreseeable effect of prohibiting or restricting the resale of tickets, including, but not limited to, issuing tickets in an electronic form that is not readily transferable to a subsequent purchaser, or conditioning entry into a venue on the presentation of a token, such as the original purchaser's credit card or state-issued identification card, which cannot be readily transferred to a subsequent purchaser.

(f) Seeking to limit the price, or to impose a minimum or maximum price, at which a ticket may be resold.
