- Section 1. (1) Consistent with the constitutional liberties of residents of this state, it is hereby declared to be the public policy of this state that no person may be compelled by federal, state, or local government to purchase health insurance or health services, except:

Section 2. The Attorney General is hereby specifically
authorized and shall have standing to initiate and otherwise
advocate such public policy in any state or federal court or
