A bill to be entitled

An act relating to biomedical and social research; repealing ss. 381.85, 381.912, 381.92, and 381.921, F.S., relating to the Florida Biomedical and Social Research Act, the Cervical Cancer Elimination Task Force, and the Florida Cancer Council and the mission and duties of the council; amending ss. 381.855 and 381.922, F.S.; deleting provisions and cross-references to conform; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Sections 381.85, 381.912, 381.92, and 381.921, Florida Statutes, are repealed.
- Section 2. Paragraph (a) of subsection (5) of section 381.855, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 381.855 Florida Center for Universal Research to Eradicate Disease.—
- (5) There is established within the center an advisory council that shall meet at least annually.
- (a) The council shall consist of one representative from a Florida not-for-profit institution engaged in basic and clinical biomedical research and education which receives more than \$10 million in annual grant funding from the National Institutes of Health, to be appointed by the State Surgeon General from a different institution each term, and one representative from and appointed by each of the following entities:

Section 3. Subsections (2) and (5) of section 381.922,

- (2) The program shall provide grants for cancer research to further the search for cures for cancer.
- (a) Emphasis shall be given to the goals enumerated in s. 381.921, as those goals support the advancement of such cures.
- (b) Preference may be given to grant proposals that foster collaborations among institutions, researchers, and community practitioners, as such proposals support the advancement of cures through basic or applied research, including clinical trials involving cancer patients and related networks.

(5) Funds appropriated for the William G. "Bill" Bankhead, Jr., and David Coley Cancer Research Program shall be distributed pursuant to this section to provide grants to researchers seeking cures for cancer and cancer-related illnesses, with emphasis given to the goals enumerated in s. 381.921. From the total funds appropriated, an amount of up to 10 percent may be used for administrative expenses. In the 2009-2010 fiscal year, 2.5 percent, not to exceed \$25 million, of the revenue deposited into the Health Care Trust Fund pursuant to s. 215.5602(12)(a) shall be transferred to the Biomedical Research Trust Fund within the Department of Health for the William G. "Bill" Bankhead, Jr., and David Coley Cancer Research Program. Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2010.
