- (e) The spoil material from maintenance dredging may be deposited in a self-contained, upland disposal site. The site is not required to be permitted if:
 - 1. The site exists as of January 1, 2011;
- 2. A professional engineer certifies that the site has been designed in accordance with generally accepted engineering standards for such disposal sites;
 - 3. The site has adequate capacity to receive and retain the



dredged material; and

- 4. The site has operating and maintenance procedures that provide for discharge of return flow of water and prevent the escape of the spoil material into state waters.
- (f) The department must be notified of the intent to use this exemption at least 30 days before the commencement of maintenance dredging. The notice shall include, if applicable, the professional engineer certification required by paragraph (e).
 - (g) (e) This section does not prohibit maintenance
