Senator Diaz de la Portilla moved the following:

Senate Amendment (with directory and title amendments)

Delete lines 127 - 132

and insert:

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(3) IMPLEMENTATION OPTIONS.-District school boards must consider, but are not limited to, implementing the following items in order to meet the constitutional class size maximums described in subsection (1):

9 (a) Adopt policies to encourage qualified students to take10 dual enrollment courses.

(b) Adopt policies to encourage students to take courses from the Florida Virtual School and school district virtual instruction programs.

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14 (c)1. Repeal district school board policies that require 15 students to have more than 24 credits to graduate from high 16 school.

17 2. Adopt policies to allow students to graduate from high 18 school as soon as they pass the grade 10 FCAT and complete the 19 courses required for high school graduation.

(d) Use methods to maximize use of instructional staff, such as changing required teaching loads and scheduling of planning periods, deploying district employees that have professional certification to the classroom, using adjunct educators, or any other method not prohibited by law.

(e) Use innovative methods to reduce the cost of school
construction by using prototype school designs, using SMART
Schools designs, participating in the School Infrastructure
Thrift Program, or any other method not prohibited by law.

29 (f) Use joint-use facilities through partnerships with 30 community colleges, state universities, and private colleges and universities. Joint-use facilities available for use as K-12 31 32 classrooms that do not meet the K-12 State Regulations for 33 Educational Facilities in the Florida Building Code may be used 34 at the discretion of the district school board provided that 35 such facilities meet all other health, life, safety, and fire 36 codes.

37 (g) Adopt alternative methods of class scheduling, such as38 block scheduling.

39 (h) Redraw school attendance zones to maximize use of 40 facilities while minimizing the additional use of 41 transportation.

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(i) Operate schools beyond the normal operating hours to



43	provide classes in the evening or operate more than one session
44	of school during the day.
45	(j) Use year-round schools and other nontraditional
46	calendars that do not adversely impact annual assessment of
47	student achievement.
48	(k) Review and consider amending any collective bargaining
49	contracts that hinder the implementation of class size
50	reduction.
51	(1) Use any other approach not prohibited by law.
52	(4) ACCOUNTABILITY.
53	(a) If the department determines that the number of
54	students assigned to any individual class exceeds the class size
55	maximum, as required in subsection (1), based upon the October
56	student membership survey, the department shall:
57	1. Identify, for each grade group, the number of classes in
58	which the number of students exceeds the maximum and the total
59	number of students which exceeds the maximum for all classes.
60	2. Determine the number of FTE students which exceeds the
61	maximum for each grade group.
62	3. Multiply the total number of FTE students which exceeds
63	the maximum for each grade group by the district's FTE dollar
64	amount of the class size categorical allocation for that year
65	and calculate the total for all three grade groups.
66	4. Multiply the total number of FTE students which exceeds
67	the maximum for all classes by an amount equal to 50 percent of
68	the base student allocation adjusted by the district cost
69	differential for the 2010-2011 fiscal year and by an amount
70	equal to the base student allocation adjusted by the district
71	cost differential beginning in the 2011-2012 fiscal year and
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72	thereafter.
73	5. Reduce the district's class size categorical allocation
74	by an amount equal to the sum of the calculations in
75	subparagraphs 3. and 4.
76	(b) The amount of funds reduced shall be the lesser of the
77	amount calculated in paragraph (a) or the undistributed balance
78	of the district's class size categorical allocation. The Florida
79	Education Finance Program Appropriation Allocation Conference
80	shall verify the department's calculation in paragraph (a). The
81	commissioner may withhold distribution of the class size
82	categorical allocation to the extent necessary to comply with
83	paragraph (a).
84	(c) In lieu of the reduction calculation in paragraph (a),
85	if the Commissioner of Education has evidence that a district
86	was unable to meet the class size requirements despite
87	appropriate efforts to do so or because of an extreme emergency,
88	the commissioner may recommend by February 15, subject to
89	approval of the Legislative Budget Commission, the reduction of
90	an alternate amount of funds from the district's class size
91	categorical allocation.
92	(d) Upon approval of the reduction calculation in
93	paragraphs (a)-(c), the commissioner must prepare a reallocation
94	of the funds made available for the districts that have fully
95	met the class size requirements. The funds shall be reallocated
96	by calculating an amount of up to 5 percent of the base student
97	allocation multiplied by the total district FTE students. The
98	reallocation total may not exceed 25 percent of the total funds
99	reduced.
100	(e) Each district that has not complied with the



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101	requirements in subsection (1) shall submit to the commissioner
102	by February 15 a plan certified by the district school board
103	that describes the specific actions the district will take in
104	order to fully comply with the requirements in subsection (1) by
105	October of the following school year. If a district submits the
106	certified plan by the required deadline, the funds remaining
107	after the reallocation calculation in paragraph (d) shall be
108	added back to the district's class size categorical allocation
109	based on each qualifying district's proportion of the total
110	reduction for all qualifying districts for which a reduction was
111	calculated in paragraphs (a)-(c). However, no district shall
112	have an amount added back that is greater than the amount that
113	was reduced.
114	(f) The department shall adjust school district class size
115	reduction categorical allocation distributions based on the
116	calculations in paragraphs (a)-(e).
117	(4) (5) TEAM-TEACHING STRATEGIES
118	(a) School districts may use teaching strategies that
119	include the assignment of more than one teacher to a classroom
120	of students and that were implemented before July 1, 2005.
121	Effective July 1, 2005, school districts may implement
122	additional teaching strategies that include the assignment of
123	more than one teacher to a classroom of students for the
124	following purposes only:
125	1. Pairing teachers for the purpose of staff development.
126	2. Pairing new teachers with veteran teachers.
127	3. Reducing turnover among new teachers.
128	4. Pairing teachers who are teaching out-of-field with
129	teachers who are in-field.
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130 5. Providing for more flexibility and innovation in the131 classroom.

132 6. Improving learning opportunities for students, including133 students who have disabilities.

(b) Teaching strategies, including team teaching, coteaching, or inclusion teaching, implemented on or after July 1, 2005, pursuant to paragraph (a) may be implemented subject to the following restrictions:

Reasonable limits shall be placed on the number of
 students in a classroom so that classrooms are not overcrowded.
 Teacher-to-student ratios within a curriculum area or grade
 level must not exceed constitutional limits.

142 2. At least one member of the team must have at least 3143 years of teaching experience.

144 3. At least one member of the team must be teaching in-145 field.

4. The teachers must be trained in team-teaching methodswithin 1 year after assignment.

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(c) As used in this subsection, the term:

149 1. "Team teaching" or "co-teaching" means two or more 150 teachers are assigned to a group of students and each teacher is 151 responsible for all of the students during the entire class 152 period. In order to be considered team teaching or co-teaching, 153 each teacher is responsible for planning, delivering, and 154 evaluating instruction for all students in the class or subject 155 for the entire class period.

156 2. "Inclusion teaching" means two or more teachers are 157 assigned to a group of students, but one of the teachers is 158 responsible for only one student or a small group of students in



159 the classroom.

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161 The use of strategies implemented as outlined in this subsection 162 meets the letter and intent of the Florida Constitution and the 163 Florida Statutes which relate to implementing class size 164 reduction, and this subsection applies retroactively. A school 165 district may not be penalized financially or otherwise as a result of the use of any legal strategy, including, but not 166 167 limited to, those set forth in subsection (3) and this 168 subsection.

169 (5) COURSES FOR COMPLIANCE.-Consistent with the provisions 170 in ss. 1003.01(14) and 1003.428, the Department of Education 171 shall identify from the Course Code Directory the core-curricula 172 courses for the purpose of satisfying the maximum class size 173 requirement in this section. The department may adopt rules to 174 implement this subsection, if necessary.

178 <u>(3) (a) Each district school board shall designate one month</u> 179 of the school year to celebrate the Founding Fathers of the 180 <u>United States of America and the principles inherent in the</u> 181 country's founding documents. This month may be coordinated with 182 <u>Celebrate Freedom Week which is observed pursuant to s.</u> 183 <u>1003.421.</u>

184 (b) During the designated month, students shall be provided 185 instruction that focuses on:

1861. The leading figures present at the country's founding187who were instrumental in crafting the founding documents and



188	setting democratic political precedent.
189	2. The moral and civic virtue, self-sacrifice, intellectual
190	genius, and patriotism demonstrated by the country's founding
191	fathers.
192	3. The founding documents, including, but not limited to,
193	the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution of the United
194	States, the Bill of Rights, and the Federalist Papers.
195	4. The historical and philosophical importance of the
196	Declaration of Independence with its emphasis that all people
197	"are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights,
198	that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of
199	happiness."
200	5. The principles inherent in the founding documents,
201	including, but not limited to, individual freedom, limited
202	representative democratic government, a free market economy and
203	system, civic virtue, national sovereignty, natural law, and
204	self-evident truth.
205	(c) The instruction may be integrated into the existing
206	school curriculum through methods including, but not limited to,
207	supplementing lesson plans, holding school assemblies, or
208	providing school-related activities.
