A bill to be entitled

An act relating to material harmful to minors; amending s. 847.012, F.S.; prohibiting certain acts involving specified material harmful to minors on school property with specified intent; providing a definition; providing criminal penalties; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsections (5) through (9) of section 847.012, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (6) through (10), respectively, a new subsection (5) is added to that section, and subsection (3) and current subsection (5) of that section are republished, to read:

847.012 Harmful materials; sale or distribution to minors or using minors in production prohibited; penalty.—

- (3) A person may not knowingly sell, rent, or loan for monetary consideration to a minor:
- (a) Any picture, photograph, drawing, sculpture, motion picture film, videocassette, or similar visual representation or image of a person or portion of the human body which depicts nudity or sexual conduct, sexual excitement, sexual battery, bestiality, or sadomasochistic abuse and which is harmful to minors; or
- (b) Any book, pamphlet, magazine, printed matter however reproduced, or sound recording that contains any matter defined in s. 847.001, explicit and detailed verbal descriptions or

narrative accounts of sexual excitement, or sexual conduct and that is harmful to minors.

- (5) An adult may not knowingly distribute, position, or situate material described in subsection (3) on school property with the intent of corrupting minors. As used in this subsection, the term "school property" means the grounds or facility of any kindergarten, elementary school, middle school, junior high school, secondary school, career center, or postsecondary school, whether public or nonpublic.
- $\underline{(6)}$ (5) Any person violating any provision of this section commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
