Comm: RCS 02/28/2012

The Committee on Budget Subcommittee on Health and Human Services Appropriations (Garcia) recommended the following:

Senate Substitute for Amendment (544742) (with title amendment)

Between lines 55 and 56 insert:

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Section 2. (1) The Legislature finds that Florida must expand its graduate medical education to meet the medical needs of its residents. The Association of American Medical Colleges ranked Florida 43rd nationally in numbers of medical residents per 100,000 population. Approximately 2,700 additional medical residency positions are required in this state simply to meet the national average per population. In accordance with these

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findings, the Agency for Health Care Administration shall establish a demonstration project by allowing prepaid managed care organizations providing behavioral health services to patients in Miami-Dade County to fund a residency program sponsored by Florida International University and administered by a federally qualified health center.

- (2) The Agency for Health Care Administration shall authorize managed care organizations providing behavioral health services directly or indirectly to Medicaid patients in Miami-Dade County to allocate up to 1 percent of the medical loss ratio to fund a new psychiatric graduate medical education program located at a federally qualified health center and sponsored by Florida International University Wertheim College of Medicine. The university shall select a federally qualified health center that has a large general psychiatric practice with the capacity to implement a new psychiatry residency program and a demonstrated commitment to establishing a new psychiatry residency program.
- (3) Payments pursuant to this section shall be made to Florida International University for the design, development, and operation of the psychiatric residency program and are deemed to be payments for behavioral health services and not administrative services. Any managed care organization allocating funds under this section must enter into an agreement with Florida International University making provision for recurring annual payments to Florida International University of up to 1 percent of the medical loss ratio for behavioral health services provided to Medicaid patients in Miami-Dade County to support the psychiatry residency program.



(4) Each January 1, beginning in 2014 and for the duration of the demonstration project, the agency shall submit to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives an annual report on the success and outcomes achieved by the demonstration project, which must include a recommendation as to whether the demonstration project should be continued, terminated, or expanded.

An act relating to Medicaid; amending s. 409.905, F.S.; revising the date for adjusting hospital inpatient rates; requiring that the Agency for Health Care Administration create a demonstration project to address funding issues related to the Medicaid program's share of medical residency training expenditures; providing for a federally qualified health center to establish a graduate medical education program in Miami-Dade County through Florida International University; providing requirements for the agreement between the university and managed care organizations allocating funds for the project; requiring that the Agency for Health Care Administration provide an annual report to the Governor and Legislature; providing an effective date.
