Senate Resolution

A resolution recognizing the invaluable contribution of digital learning to improved student success and expressing gratitude to parents, teachers, and digital learning providers for embracing digital learning in order to better the educational opportunities of students in this state.

WHEREAS, education in the digital age must provide students with the knowledge and skills necessary to succeed in college and in challenging 21st century careers, and

WHEREAS, according to the National Assessment for Educational Progress, a third of fourth graders in America, and 47 percent of fourth graders in this state, don't read on grade level, and

WHEREAS, according to the National Governors Association, more than 1 million students in America don't earn a high school diploma, and

WHEREAS, increased demand for skilled workers, a shortage of effective educators, and decreasing state revenues are obstacles to providing a high-quality education, and

WHEREAS, digital learning can expand access to rigorous and relevant curriculum with highly effective instructors, regardless of where students reside, and

WHEREAS, digital learning can extend the reach of highly effective teachers in high-demand subjects, such as science and math, and

WHEREAS, digital learning can offer a cost-effective approach to providing a high-quality education, and

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WHEREAS, digital learning can customize education to allow students to advance at their own pace, to globally expand the body of knowledge that a student is able to access, better prepare students for college and the world of work, and to provide students access to real-world instruction, and

WHEREAS, former Florida Governor Jeb Bush and former West Virginia Governor Bob Wise convened the Digital Learning Council, a diverse group of national leaders in education, technology, government, business, and think tanks, to develop state-level policies that harness the power of technology to ensure that each and every student receives a high-quality education, and

WHEREAS, the Digital Learning Council developed 10 Elements of High Quality Digital Learning, which provides the framework to transform education for the digital age, and

WHEREAS, Digital Learning Now! is a national effort to raise awareness of the benefits of digital learning to improve student outcomes, and

WHEREAS, the Sunshine State leads the nation in transforming education for the digital age in a manner accountable to all Floridians, and

WHEREAS, Florida is one of the only states in the nation to provide all students, from kindergarten through 12th grade, with a robust offering of digital learning options, including the nationally recognized Florida Virtual School, and

WHEREAS, February 1, 2012, is being recognized nationally as "Digital Learning Day" in order to raise awareness of the transformational power of digital learning and to encourage policymakers to put the needs of the student first by expanding

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digital learning opportunities, free of the restrictions of time, place, and pace, NOW, THEREFORE,

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Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:

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That the members of the Senate recognize digital learning and its contribution to improving student preparedness for postsecondary education and 21st century careers, and reaffirm the Senate's continued commitment to expanding digital learning for the benefit of students and all Floridians.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution, with the Seal of the Senate affixed, be presented to the Florida Virtual School, school district virtual instruction programs, and approved digital learning providers as a tangible token of the sentiments of the Florida Senate.
