A bill to be entitled

An act relating to state employee salaries; providing a short title; providing a competitive pay adjustment for state employees; requiring an appropriation; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, the delivery of exceptional public service is imperative in this state, which competitively seeks business opportunities internationally and nationally, which encourages tourism, and which invites businesses and their employees to relocate here to live, work, and play, and

WHEREAS, state employees are uniquely responsible for providing services that ensure that Florida is and remains desirable and competitive for tourists and that ensure businesses believe and know that their employees are safe on our roads, beaches, and lakes; and that the water they may drink, the air they breathe, the food they eat, and the schools they may send their children to or attend are at least safe and high-quality and encourages them to live, work, and play here, and

WHEREAS, if we are to operate the State of Florida more like a business, that must mean that the state operates efficiently, effectively, and competitively, and our state employees are fundamental to that excellence, and

WHEREAS, it is good business to treat employees ethically, morally, and with attention to morale, and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida seeks to provide the high quality-of-life services that are consistent with the services that developed nations offer for their citizens and that lift and empower all citizens regardless of income, in contrast to

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undeveloped nations that are marked by a poor quality of life and a lack of basic public services, and

WHEREAS, state employees provide services to all Floridians that, for moral and ethical reasons, are human rights guaranteed to all without discrimination and that include ensuring justice in our courts, protection on our roads and byways, and reasonable assurance of safety from crime and mayhem, and

WHEREAS, state employees, as public servants, work to provide services essential to modern life, such as law enforcement, child protection, ensuring water and air quality, food safety, transportation infrastructure, protection against the spread of contagious disease and other public health issues, and the protection of natural resources for the enjoyment of all for generations, and

WHEREAS, state employees provide services to the public, services arrived at through social consensus and the social contract expressed through our democratic process that certain services should be available to all, regardless of income, and

WHEREAS, Florida has the most efficient state workforce in the nation and is a very complex state that is home to diverse cultures and languages, and

WHEREAS, in 2011, state governments nationwide reported an average of 213 state government employees per 10,000 residents, while Florida reported only 112 state government employees per 10,000 residents, the lowest ratio in the nation, which is 47.4 percent less than the national average, and

WHEREAS, that same year, the state government national average was \$74 in employee payroll expenditures per state resident, while Florida's employee payroll expenditure was \$37

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per state resident, the lowest labor cost for state public services per resident in the nation, a ratio that is 50 percent less than the national average, and

WHEREAS, state jobs that provide for the public good often require rigorous education and training and the development of highly technical skills, such that many state employees are well-prepared for jobs in the competitive marketplace in forprofit corporations but choose to work for the good of their neighbors and fellow citizens, and

WHEREAS, under the present conditions, state employees are overburdened because of cutbacks, layoffs, and the passage of 7 years without a competitive pay adjustment to their compensation and benefits, and

WHEREAS, the Office of Economic and Demographic Research estimates that general revenue will increase by 4.7 percent during the next fiscal year, and

WHEREAS, modernizing tax collection through Mainstreet Fairness and Marketplace Fairness acts will allow for more complete collection of taxes owed to the state, and

WHEREAS, Florida's state employees are long-deserving of recognition for their steadfast performance of public service to the citizens of the state through receipt of a competitive pay adjustment, NOW THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. This act may be cited as the "State Employee Fairness Act."

Section 2. (1) Effective July 1, 2013, each state employee
