Subsection (2) of section 112.324, Florida 21 Statutes, is amended to read: 22 112.324 Procedures on complaints of violations; public records and meeting exemptions.-23 24 (2) (a) The complaint and records relating to the complaint 25 or to any preliminary investigation held by the commission or 26 its agents, by a Commission on Ethics and Public Trust 27 established by any county defined in s. 125.011(1) or by any municipality defined in s. 165.031, or by any county or 28 Page 1 of 4

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29 municipality that has established a local investigatory process 30 to enforce more stringent standards of conduct and disclosure 31 requirements as provided in s. 112.326 are confidential and 32 exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. 34 (b) Written referrals and records relating to such 35 referrals held by the commission or its agents, the Governor, 36 the Department of Law Enforcement, or a state attorney, and 37 records relating to any preliminary investigation of such 38 referrals held by the commission or its agents, are confidential 39 and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State 40 Constitution.

41 (c) (b) Any portion of a proceeding conducted by the 42 commission, a Commission on Ethics and Public Trust, or a county 43 or municipality that has established such local investigatory 44 process, pursuant to a complaint or preliminary investigation, 45 is exempt from the provisions of s. 286.011, s. 24(b), Art. I of 46 the State Constitution, and s. 120.525.

47 (d) Any portion of a proceeding of the commission in which 48 <u>a determination regarding a referral is discussed or acted upon</u> 49 <u>is exempt from s. 286.011, s. 24(b), Art. I of the State</u> 50 Constitution, and s. 120.525.

51 <u>(e) (c)</u> The exemptions in paragraphs <u>(a) - (d)</u> <del>(a) and (b)</del> 52 apply until:

53 <u>1.</u> The complaint is dismissed as legally insufficient  $\underline{i_{\tau}}$ 54 until

55 <u>2.</u> The alleged violator requests in writing that such 56 records and proceedings be made public; $_{\overline{\tau}}$ 

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57 <u>3. The commission determines that it will not investigate</u> 58 the referral; or <del>until</del>

64 (f) In no event shall a complaint under this part against 65 a candidate in any general, special, or primary election be 66 filed or any intention of filing such a complaint be disclosed 67 on the day of any such election or within the 5 days immediately 68 preceding the date of the election.

69 (g) (d) This subsection is subject to the Open Government 70 Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand 71 repealed on October 2, <u>2018</u> <del>2015</del>, unless reviewed and saved from 72 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

Section 2. (1) The Legislature finds that it is a public 73 74 necessity that written referrals and records relating to such 75 referrals held by the Commission on Ethics or its agents, the 76 Governor, the Department of Law Enforcement, or a state 77 attorney, and records relating to any preliminary investigation 78 of such referrals held by the commission or its agents, be 79 confidential and exempt from public records requirements until 80 the commission determines that it will not investigate the 81 referral, until the alleged violator requests in writing that 82 such records be made public, or until it is determined by the 83 commission, based upon a preliminary investigation of the 84 referral, whether probable cause exists to believe that a

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85 violation has occurred. This exemption is necessary because the 86 release of such information could potentially be defamatory to an individual under investigation, cause unwarranted damage to 87 88 the reputation of such individual, or significantly impair the 89 integrity of the investigation. The Legislature also finds that it is a public 90 (2) necessity that portions of proceedings of the Commission on 91 92 Ethics at which a determination regarding a referral is 93 discussed or acted upon be exempt from public meetings 94 requirements until the commission determines that it will not 95 investigate the referral, until the alleged violator requests in 96 writing that such proceedings be made public, or until it is 97 determined by the commission, based on a preliminary investigation of the referral, whether probable cause exists to 98 99 believe that a violation has occurred. This exemption is necessary because the release of such information could 100 potentially be defamatory to an individual under investigation, 101 102 cause unwarranted damage to the reputation of such individual, 103 or significantly impair the integrity of the investigation. 104 Section 3.
