Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Section 311.103, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 311.103 Designation of state freight logistics zones.-
- (1) A local government may apply to the Department of Transportation for designation of a geographic area or areas within its jurisdiction as a freight logistics zone. The local government shall submit an application developed by the department that includes, but is not limited to:
- (a) A map depicting the geographic area or areas to be included within the designation.
- (b) Identification of existing transportation infrastructure, such as roads, rail, airports, and seaports, within or in close proximity to the proposed freight logistics zone.

- (d) Identification of any local, state, or federal workforce training capabilities available for a business seeking to locate or expand within the proposed zone.
- (e) Identification of any local, state, or federal plans, including transportation, seaport, or airport plans, concerning the movement of freight within or in close proximity to the proposed zone.
- (f) Identification of financial or other local government incentives to encourage new development, expansion of existing development, or redevelopment within the proposed zone.
- (2) Beginning July 1, 2013, the secretary may designate up to four pilot freight logistics zones in the state in consultation with the Department of Economic Opportunity, the Florida Seaport Transportation and Economic Development Council and other public and private stakeholders. These zones may be eligible for priority in state funding and incentive programs relating to freight logistics zones, including applicable programs identified in parts I, III, and V of chapter 288 and s. 311.101.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013.
