insert:

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Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 1002.45, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1002.45 Virtual instruction programs.-

(2) PROVIDER QUALIFICATIONS.-

9 (a) The department shall annually publish online a list of 10 providers approved to offer virtual instruction programs. To be 11 approved by the department, a provider must document that it:

I. Is nonsectarian in its programs, admission policies,
 employment practices, and operations;

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14 2. Complies with the antidiscrimination provisions of s. 1000.05; 15 3. Locates an administrative office or offices in this 16 17 state, requires its administrative staff to be state residents, Requires all instructional staff to be Florida-certified 18 teachers under chapter 1012 or certified as adjunct educators 19 under s. 1012.57, and conducts background screenings for all 20 employees or contracted personnel, as required by s. 1012.32, 21 2.2 using state and national criminal history records; 23 4. Provides to parents and students specific information 24 posted and accessible online which includes, but is not limited 25 to, the following teacher-parent and teacher-student contact information for each course: 26 27 a. How to contact the instructor via telephone, e-mail, or 28 online messaging tools. 29 b. How to contact technical support via telephone, e-mail, 30 or online messaging tools. c. How to contact the administration office or an 31 32 individual offering online courses, including, but not limited to, massive open online courses, via telephone, e-mail, or 33 34 online messaging tools. 35 d. Any requirement for regular contact with the instructor 36 for the course and clear expectations for meeting the 37 requirement. 38 e. A requirement that the instructor in each course, with 39 the exception of individuals offering online courses, including, but not limited to, massive open online courses, must, at a 40 minimum, conduct one contact via telephone with the parent and 41 42 the student each month;

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43 <u>5.4.</u> Possesses prior, successful experience offering online 44 courses to elementary, middle, or high school students as 45 demonstrated by quantified student learning gains in each 46 subject area and grade level provided for consideration as an 47 instructional program option;

48 <u>6.5.</u> Is accredited by a regional accrediting association as 49 defined by State Board of Education rule;

50 <u>7.6.</u> Ensures instructional and curricular quality through a 51 detailed curriculum and student performance accountability plan 52 that addresses every subject and grade level it intends to 53 provide through contract with the school district, including:

a. Courses and programs that meet the standards of the
International Association for K-12 Online Learning and the
Southern Regional Education Board.

b. Instructional content and services that align with, and
measure student attainment of, student proficiency in the Next
Generation Sunshine State Standards.

c. Mechanisms that determine and ensure that a student has
satisfied requirements for grade level promotion and high school
graduation with a standard diploma, as appropriate;

<u>8.7.</u> Publishes for the general public, in accordance with
disclosure requirements adopted in rule by the State Board of
Education, as part of its application as a provider and in all
contracts negotiated pursuant to this section:

a. Information and data about the curriculum of each full-time and part-time program.

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b. School policies and procedures.

70 c. Certification status and physical location of all71 administrative and instructional personnel.



72 d. Hours and times of availability of instructional 73 personnel. e. Student-teacher ratios. 74 75 f. Student completion and promotion rates. 76 g. Student, educator, and school performance accountability 77 outcomes; 78 9.8. If the provider is a Florida College System 79 institution, employs instructors who meet the certification 80 requirements for instructional staff under chapter 1012; and 81 10.9.
