14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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16	Section 1. Section 381.0044, Florida Statutes, is created
17	to read:
18	<u>381.0044</u> Hepatitis C testing.—
19	(1) As used in this section, the term:
20	(a) "Health care practitioner" means a person licensed
21	under chapter 458 or chapter 459 or an advanced registered nurse
22	practitioner certified under part I of chapter 464.
23	(b) "Hepatitis C diagnostic test" means a laboratory test
24	that detects the presence of the Hepatitis C virus in the blood
25	and provides confirmation of a Hepatitis C virus infection.
26	(c) "Hepatitis C screening test" means any Food and Drug
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27	Administration (FDA)-approved laboratory screening test, FDA-
28	approved rapid point-of-care test, or other FDA-approved test
29	that detects the presence of Hepatitis C antibodies in the
30	blood.
31	(2) A person born between January 1, 1945, and December
32	31, 1965, who receives health care services as an inpatient in a
33	general hospital as defined in s. 395.002, receives primary care
34	services in a hospital inpatient or outpatient setting, or
35	receives primary care services from a health care practitioner
36	shall be offered a Hepatitis C screening test unless the health
37	care practitioner providing those services reasonably believes
38	that the person:
39	(a) Is being treated for a life-threatening emergency;
40	(b) Has previously been offered or has been the subject of
41	a Hepatitis C screening test; however, if the person's medical
42	condition indicates the need for testing, a test shall be
43	offered; or
44	(c) Lacks the capacity to consent to a Hepatitis C
45	screening test.
46	(3) If a patient accepts the offer of a Hepatitis C
47	screening test and receives a positive test result, the health
48	care practitioner shall forward the results to the patient's
49	primary care health care practitioner who can provide the
50	appropriate counseling and followup health care. The followup
51	health care shall include a Hepatitis C diagnostic test.
52	(4) The Department of Health shall adopt rules to
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53	implement culturally and linguistically appropriate procedures
54	for offering Hepatitis C screening in accordance with this
55	section and must make available to health care practitioners a
56	standard Hepatitis C information sheet to use when discussing
57	and offering the screening test to patients.
58	(5) This section does not affect the scope of practice of
59	a health care practitioner or diminish the authority or legal or
60	professional obligation of any health care practitioner to offer
61	<u>a Hepatitis C screening test or Hepatitis C diagnostic test or</u>
62	to provide services or followup health care for the subject of a
63	Hepatitis C screening test or Hepatitis C diagnostic test.
64	(6) On or before January 1, 2016, the State Surgeon
65	General shall submit a status report on the Hepatitis C testing
66	program established in this section to the Governor, the
67	President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
68	Representatives, and the chairs of the appropriate substantive
69	committees of the Legislature.
70	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
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
