## Amendment

Remove lines 31-52 and insert:
(b) Identify measures that would lead to the efficient use of reclaimed water.
(c) Identify the environmental, engineering, public health, public perception, and fiscal constraints of such an expansion, including utility rate structures for reclaimed water.
(d) Identify areas in the state where traditional water supply sources are limited and the use of reclaimed water, stormwater, or excess surface water for irrigation or other purposes is necessary.
(e) Recommend permit incentives, such as extending current authorizations for long-term consumptive use permits for all

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entities that substitute reclaimed water for traditional water
sources that become unavailable or otherwise cost prohibitive.
(f) Determine the feasibility, benefit, and cost estimate
of the infrastructure needed to construct regional storage
features on public or private lands for reclaimed water,
stormwater, and excess surface water, including the collection
and delivery mechanisms for beneficial uses such as agricultural
irrigation, power generation, public water supply, wetland
restoration, groundwater recharge, and waterbody base flow
augmentation.
(3) The departments shall:
(a) Hold two public meetings, at a minimum, to gather
input on the study.

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
