House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to enact legislation to provide a reasonable rate phase-in for all primary residences procuring flood insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program.

WHEREAS, on July 6, 2012, President Barack Obama signed into law the Surface Transportation Extension Act of 2012, also known as the Biggert-Waters Flood Insurance Reform Act of 2012, which reauthorizes the National Flood Insurance Program through 2017, and

WHEREAS, the Biggert-Waters Flood Insurance Reform Act of 2012 does not authorize a phase-in of insurance rates for flood insurance procured through the National Flood Insurance Program for homeowners who purchase their primary residence after July 6, 2012, although the act contains a phase-in of flood insurance rate increases for other residences, and

WHEREAS, Florida has over 2 million flood insurance policies, representing every county in the state, procured through the National Flood Insurance Program, accounting for 37 percent of the program's total policies, and

WHEREAS, according to the National Flood Insurance Program, from 1978 through 2012, the program collected almost \$13.6

billion in earned flood insurance premiums and paid flood losses of almost \$3.7 billion for properties located in Florida, and

WHEREAS, Florida homeowners who purchase a new flood insurance policy for their primary residence after July 6, 2012, face unprecedented rate increases for such insurance, and those increases will inhibit real estate sales in Florida, further eroding the state's economy at the very time when the economy and real estate market are recovering, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the United States Congress is urged to enact legislation to provide a reasonable rate phase-in for all primary residences procuring flood insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
