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House Resolution

A resolution recognizing the 82nd anniversary of Miami Shores Village.

5 WHEREAS, in the 19th century, the founding settlers of what 6 would eventually be known as Miami Shores Village came to the 7 area, naming it Biscayne in the early 1870s, and

8 WHEREAS, although growth waxed and waned, activity in the 9 area steadily increased upon completion of its first road in 10 1892, aiding commerce and giving rise to starch and saw mills, a 11 tomato packing plant, a grapefruit grove, and a pineapple 12 plantation, and

WHEREAS, in 1924, the Shoreland Company purchased various land holdings in the area and officially renamed the area Miami Shores, and

16 WHEREAS, on January 2, 1932, the Florida Legislature and 17 the Village Council of Miami Shores made Miami Shores Village an 18 official municipality, and

19 WHEREAS, growth was sporadic in the 1930s because of the 20 Great Depression and ceased altogether during World War II, but 21 construction boomed after the war's end, introducing an engaging 22 mix of residential architecture, and

23 WHEREAS, the majority of important community structures in 24 Miami Shores Village were completed during the post-war period,

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25	including the country club, the community center, Village Hall,
26	and the Brockway Memorial Library, and
27	WHEREAS, today, Miami Shores Village, also known as "the
28	Village Beautiful," has a population of 10,493 and is a modern
29	residential community with an active civic life and a responsive
30	local government, NOW, THEREFORE,
