An act relating to the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families State Plan; providing for the use of funds provided under the plan for the purchase of disposable diapers by parents receiving financial assistance under certain conditions and consistent with federal law; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, existing law requires each county to provide cash assistance and other social services to needy families through the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families State Plan, and

WHEREAS, existing federal law classifies diapers, together with cigarettes and alcohol, as disallowed purchases under the Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants, and Children, and

WHEREAS, low-income parents cannot take advantage of subsidized child care if they cannot afford to provide disposable diapers as required by most child care centers, and

WHEREAS, without access to child care, these parents are less able to attend work or school on a consistent basis, leading to increased economic instability, and

WHEREAS, lack of sufficient diapers can lead to multiple problems for families in need, including unhappy babies, unhealthy communities, undereducated toddlers, and underemployed adults, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation that will empower families that receive public assistance and who have children who are wearing diapers to return to the workforce by removing obstacles to obtaining
