Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Subsection (1) and paragraph (b) of subsection (8) of section 322.051, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 322.051 Identification cards.-

Any person who is 5 years of age or older, or any 10 (1) 11 person who has a disability, regardless of age, who applies for 12 a disabled parking permit under s. 320.0848, may be issued an identification card by the department upon completion of an 13 14 application and payment of an application fee.
