49	kindergarten through grade 12 if the individual is an expert in

52	submit to and pass the background screening and fingerprinting					
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53	requirements of subsection (10).
54	(c) The State Board of Education shall, by rule, define
55	the term "expert in the field" for purposes of this subsection.
