Section 16. Paragraph (i) of subsection (12) and subsection (26) of section 1001.42, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

1001.42 Powers and duties of district school board.—The district school board, acting as a board, shall exercise all powers and perform all duties listed below:



(12) FINANCE.—Take steps to assure students adequate educational facilities through the financial procedure authorized in chapters 1010 and 1011 and as prescribed below:

(i) Contracts for materials, supplies, and services.-Contract for materials, supplies, and services needed for the district school system. No contract for supplying these needs shall be made with any member of the district school board, with the district school superintendent, or with any business organization in which any district school board member or the district school superintendent has any financial interest whatsoever. The district school board may adopt rules to facilitate the efficient and effective procurement of materials, supplies, and services, including the use of online procurement and electronic auction services. As used in this paragraph, the term "electronic auction services" means a competitive procurement conducted on a centralized website using third-party software, jointly managed by an approved vendor and the district school board, for the purpose of obtaining competitive prices in an auction environment.
