5 Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 381.887, Florida
6 Statutes, is amended to read:

7 381.887 Emergency treatment for suspected opioid
8 overdose.—

9 (3) An authorized health care practitioner may prescribe
10 and dispense an emergency opioid antagonist to a patient or
11 caregiver for use in accordance with this section, and
12 pharmacists may dispense an emergency opioid antagonist pursuant
13 to such a prescription or pursuant to a non-patient-specific
14 standing order for an autoinjection delivery system or

15 intranasal application delivery system, which must be issued in
16 the name of the patient or caregiver, which is appropriately
17 labeled with instructions for use. Such patient or caregiver is
18 authorized to store and possess approved emergency opioid
19 antagonists and, in an emergency situation when a physician is
20 not immediately available, administer the emergency opioid
21 antagonist to a person believed in good faith to be experiencing
22 an opioid overdose, regardless of whether that person has a
23 prescription for an emergency opioid antagonist.
