A bill to be entitled

An act relating to income inequality; providing a short title; requiring the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability to conduct a study to identify the legislative actions and funding necessary to achieve specified goals; specifying actions that may be included in the study; requiring the office to submit a report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by a certain date; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Income Inequality Study Act."

Section 2. The Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability shall:

- (1) Conduct a study to identify the actions, and the funding necessary to support these actions, which the Legislature may take, including, but not limited to, reinstating the intangibles tax, revising the corporate income tax, and making the sales tax less regressive, to achieve the following goals:
 - (a) Reduce income disparity to the 1970 level.
- (b) Strengthen the prevention, identification, and prosecution of identity theft.
- (c) Strengthen the prevention, identification, and prosecution of consumer fraud, including, but not limited to, mortgage fraud.
- (d) Provide a level of funding to public education equal to the national average level of funding per student in grades K-12 and in higher education.

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(e) Provide a level of funding that meets the national average level for unemployment compensation.

- (f) Provide a level of funding that meets the national average level of funding for early childhood education.
- (g) Determine the incremental yearly increases needed to establish the state minimum wage as a livable wage over a 5-year period as it relates to a single person, to one wage earner in a family of two which consists of one adult and one child, and to a family of three which consists of one adult and two children.
- (2) Submit a report of its findings and determinations to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by November 1, 2016.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
