Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1009.621, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1009.621 Teacher Certification Reimbursement and Loan Repayment Program.—

- (1) To retain qualified and effective teachers within the state's public schools, there is established the Teacher Certification Reimbursement and Loan Repayment Program to be administered by the Department of Education. The function of the program is to reimburse eligible teachers who hold a professional certificate pursuant to s. 1012.56 for costs incurred in meeting the mastery of professional preparation and education competence requirements of the professional certificate or make payments that offset loans incurred in meeting the requirement.
- (2) A teacher is eligible to participate in the program if he or she:
- (a) Teaches for 3 years in a public school with a temporary certificate issued pursuant to s. 1012.56(7)(b);
- (b) Completes the requirements for and earns a professional certificate pursuant to s. 1012.56(7)(a); and

(c) Upon earning a professional certificate, teaches for an additional 2 years in a public school.

- (3) From funds appropriated for the program, the department may reimburse an eligible teacher or may make a loan payment on behalf of an eligible teacher for the costs of tuition, fees, and books associated with a state-approved teacher preparation program from a state university or Florida College System institution or a Florida Educator Preparation Institute program necessary to meet the mastery of professional preparation and education competence pursuant to s. 1012.56(6).
- (4) The department may recover costs of administering the program from funds appropriated for the program.
- (5) The State Board of Education may adopt rules necessary to administer the program.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.
