(b)<u>1.</u> Be governed by a board of directors, which must consist of <u>20</u> up to 15 members appointed by the Governor, which include:

a. Ten members representing Florida major league franchises of Major League Baseball, National Basketball Association, National Football League, Arena Football League, National Hockey

11 League, and Major League Soccer teams domiciled in this state. b. A member representing Florida Sports Commissions. 12 c. A member representing the boating and fishing industries 13 14 in Florida. 15 d. A member representing the golf industry in Florida. 16 e. A member representing Major League Baseball spring 17 training. 18 f. A member representing the auto racing industry in 19 Florida. 20 g. Five members at-large. and up to 15 members appointed by the existing board of directors. In making at-large 21 22 appointments, the governor board must consider a potential 23 member's background in community service and sports activism in, 24 and financial support of, the sports industry, professional 25 sports, or organized amateur athletics. Members must be 26 residents of the state and highly knowledgeable about or active 27 in professional or organized amateur sports. 28 2. The board must contain representatives of all 29 geographical regions of the state and must represent ethnic and gender diversity. The terms of office of the members shall be 4 30

years. No member may serve more than two consecutive terms. The Governor may remove any member for cause and shall fill all vacancies that occur.

34 (c) Have as its purpose, as stated in its articles of 35 incorporation, to receive, hold, invest, and administer 36 property; to raise funds and receive gifts; and to promote and 37 develop the sports industry and related industries for the 38 purpose of increasing the economic presence of these industries 39 in Florida.

(d) Have a prior determination by the <u>department</u> Office of
Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development that the organization
will benefit the <u>department</u> office and act in the best interests
of the state as a direct-support organization to the <u>department</u>
office.

(3) The <u>Florida Sports Foundation shall operate under</u> <u>contract with the department. The department shall enter into a</u> <u>contract with the foundation by July 1, 2016. The contract must</u> <u>provide</u> Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development shall contract with the organization and shall include in the contract that:

(a) The <u>department</u> office may review the <u>foundation's</u> organization's articles of incorporation.

(b) The <u>foundation</u> organization shall submit an annual budget proposal to the <u>department</u> office, on a form provided by the <u>department</u> office, in accordance with <u>department</u> office procedures for filing budget proposals based upon the recommendation of the department office.

(c) Any funds that the <u>foundation</u> organization holds in trust will revert to the state upon the expiration or cancellation of the contract.

(d) The <u>foundation</u> organization is subject to an annual financial and performance review by the <u>department</u> office to determine whether the <u>foundation</u> organization is complying with the terms of the contract and whether it is acting in a manner consistent with the goals of the <u>department</u> office and in the best interests of the state.

(e) The fiscal year of the <u>foundation begins</u> organization
 will begin July 1 of each year and <u>ends</u> end June 30 of the next

(4) The <u>department</u> Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development may allow the <u>foundation</u> organization to use the property, facilities, personnel, and services of the <u>department</u> office if the <u>foundation</u> organization provides equal employment opportunities to all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex, age, or national origin, subject to the approval of the executive director of the department office.

(5) The <u>foundation</u> organization shall provide for an annual financial audit in accordance with s. 215.981.

(6) The <u>foundation</u> organization is not granted any taxing power.

(7) In exercising the power provided in this section, the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development may authorize and contract with the direct-support organization existing on June 30, 1996, and authorized by the former Florida Department of Commerce to promote sports-related industries. An appointed member of the board of directors of such direct-support organization as of June 30, 1996, may serve the remainder of his or her unexpired term.

(7) (8) To promote amateur sports and physical fitness, the foundation direct-support organization shall:

(a) Develop, foster, and coordinate services and programs for amateur sports for the people of Florida.

(b) Sponsor amateur sports workshops, clinics, conferences, and other similar activities.

(c) Give recognition to outstanding developments and achievements in, and contributions to, amateur sports.

(d) Encourage, support, and assist local governments and

100 (e) Promote Florida as a host for national and101 international amateur athletic competitions.

(f) Develop a statewide <u>programs</u> program of amateur athletic competition to be known as the <u>"Florida Senior Games"</u> and the "Sunshine State Games."

(g) Continue the successful amateur sports programs previously conducted by the Florida Governor's Council on Physical Fitness and Amateur Sports created under former s. 14.22.

(h) Encourage and continue the use of volunteers in its amateur sports programs to the maximum extent possible.

(i) Develop, foster, and coordinate services and programsdesigned to encourage the participation of Florida's youth inOlympic sports activities and competitions.

(j) Foster and coordinate services and programs designed to contribute to the physical fitness of the citizens of Florida.

116 (8) (9) (a) The Sunshine State Games and Florida Senior Games 117 shall both be patterned after the Summer Olympics with 118 variations as necessitated by availability of facilities, 119 equipment, and expertise. The games shall be designed to 120 encourage the participation of athletes representing a broad 121 range of age groups, skill levels, and Florida communities. 122 Participants shall be residents of this state. Regional 123 competitions shall be held throughout the state, and the top 124 qualifiers in each sport shall proceed to the final competitions 125 to be held at a site in the state with the necessary facilities 126 and equipment for conducting the competitions.



(b) The <u>department</u> Executive Office of the Governor is authorized to permit the use of property, facilities, and personal services of or at any State University System facility or institution by the direct-support organization operating the Sunshine State Games <u>and Florida Senior Games</u>. For the purposes of this paragraph,
