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21	Section 1. Present subsections (3) through (44) of section
22	97.021, Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (4)
23	through (45), respectively, and a new subsection (3) is added to

26	where the context clearly indicates otherwise, the term:
27	(3) "Address of legal residence" means the legal
28	residential address of the elector and includes all information
29	necessary to differentiate one residence from another,

31	suite, lot, room, or dormitory room number or other identifier.

40	Failure to include a distinguishing apartment, suite, lot, room,
41	or dormitory room number or other identifier on a voter

43	to register to vote or cast a ballot, and such an omission may
44	not serve as the basis for a challenge to a voter's eligibility
45	or as a reason to not count a ballot.

47	4. A mark in the checkbox affirming that the applicant is a
48	citizen of the United States.
49	5.a. The applicant's current and valid Florida driver
50	license number or the identification number from a Florida

96	(12) Each supervisor shall maintain a list of valid
97	residential street addresses for purposes of verifying the legal
98	addresses of voters residing in the supervisor's county. <u>To the</u>
99	maximum extent practicable, the list must include information
100	necessary to differentiate one residence from another,
101	including, but not limited to, a distinguishing apartment,
102	suite, lot, room, or dormitory room number or other identifier.
103	If a voter registration application does not include information
104	necessary to differentiate one residence from another, the
105	supervisor shall make all reasonable efforts to obtain such
106	information in order to maintain the list of valid residential
107	street address. The supervisor shall make all reasonable efforts
108	to coordinate with county 911 service providers, property
109	appraisers, the United States Postal Service, or other agencies
110	as necessary to ensure the continued accuracy of such list. The
111	supervisor shall provide the list of valid residential addresses
112	to the statewide voter registration system in the manner and
113	frequency specified by rule of the department.

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Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2016.

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
