Subsection (1) of section 327.73, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 327.73 Noncriminal infractions.-(1) Violations of the following provisions of the vessel laws of this state are noncriminal infractions <u>unless otherwise</u> <u>provided:</u> (a) Section 373.469, relating to protection zones for

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80	Any person cited for a violation of any provision of this
81	subsection, unless otherwise provided, shall be deemed to be
82	charged with a noncriminal infraction, shall be cited for such
83	an infraction, and shall be cited to appear before the county
84	court. The civil penalty for any such infraction is \$50, except
85	as otherwise provided in this section. Any person who fails to
86	appear or otherwise properly respond to a uniform boating
87	citation shall, in addition to the charge relating to the
88	violation of the boating laws of this state, be charged with the
89	offense of failing to respond to such citation and, upon
90	conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor of the second degree,
91	punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. A written
92	warning to this effect shall be provided at the time such

97	(1) As used in this section, the term:
98	(a) "Commission" means the Fish and Wildlife Conservation
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(b)	"Navigable waters of the United States" means the
waters c	f the United States, including the territorial seas, as
referenc	ed in the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. ss. 1251 et seq.,
and the	federal rules and regulations promulgated thereunder.
(C)	"Vessel" has the same meaning as provided in s. 327.02.
(2)	The commission may establish by rule protection zones
that res	trict the speed and operation of vessels to protect and
prevent	harm to springs. This harm includes negative impacts to
water qu	ality, water quantity, hydrology, wetlands, and aquatic-
and wetl	and-dependent species.
(3)	The commission shall develop such protection zones in
consulta	tion with in consultation and coordination with the
water ma	nagement district, the Department of Environmental
Protecti	on, and the governing bodies of the county and
municipa	lity, if applicable, in which the zone is located. If
the zone	includes navigable waters of the United States, the
commissi	on shall additionally coordinate with the United States
Coast Gu	ard and the United States Army Corps of Engineers.
(4)	Any individual who operates a vessel in violation of a
spring <u>p</u>	rotection zone rule adopted pursuant to this section
shall be	charged on a uniform boating citation as provided in s.
327.74 a	nd is subject to the following penalties:
(a)	First and second violations are noncriminal
infracti	ons, punishable as provided in s. 327.73(1)(a).
(b)	Third and subsequent violations are misdemeanors of the
second d	egree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s.
775.083.	
(5)	Restrictions in a protection zone do not apply:

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128	(a) To law enforcement, firefighting, or rescue personnel
129	operating a vessel in the course of performing their official
130	duties; or
131	(b) In emergency situations. However, the emergency
132	operation of a vessel must be a reasonable response given the
133	circumstances.

141	(3) Any commission-approved boater education or boater

144	developed or approved by the commission must include a component
145	regarding diving vessels, awareness of divers in the water,
146	divers-down warning devices flags and buoys, and the
147	requirements of s. 327.331.
148	Section 5. Subsection (1) of section 327.731, Florida
149	Statutes, is amended to read:
150	327.731 Mandatory education for violators
151	(1) A person convicted of a criminal violation under this
152	chapter, convicted of a noncriminal infraction under this
153	chapter if the infraction resulted in a reportable boating
154	accident, or convicted of two noncriminal infractions as
155	specified in <u>s. 327.73(1)(i)-(l)</u> , (n), (p), (q), and (t)-(y) s.
156	327.73(1)(h)-(k), (m), (o), (p), and (s)-(x), said infractions



157 occurring within a 12-month period, must:

(a) Enroll in, attend, and successfully complete, at his or
her own expense, a classroom or online boating safety course
that is approved by and meets the minimum standards established
by commission rule;

(b) File with the commission within 90 days proof of successful completion of the course; and

(c) Refrain from operating a vessel until he or she has filed proof of successful completion of the course with the commission.

Section 6. For the purpose of incorporating the amendment made by this act to section 327.331, Florida Statutes, in a reference thereto, subsection (1) of section 327.33, Florida Statutes, is reenacted to read:

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327.33 Reckless or careless operation of vessel.-

172 (1) It is unlawful to operate a vessel in a reckless 173 manner. A person is quilty of reckless operation of a vessel who 174 operates any vessel, or manipulates any water skis, aquaplane, 175 or similar device, in willful or wanton disregard for the safety 176 of persons or property at a speed or in a manner as to endanger, 177 or likely to endanger, life or limb, or damage the property of, 178 or injure any person. Reckless operation of a vessel includes, 179 but is not limited to, a violation of s. 327.331(6). Any person who violates a provision of this subsection commits a 180 181 misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. 182
