A bill to be entitled

An act relating to public records; amending s. 440.185, F.S.; providing an exemption from public records requirements for the personal identifying information of an injured or deceased employee which is contained in certain notices or reports filed with the Division of Workers' Compensation of the Department of Financial Services; authorizing the division to disclose such information under certain circumstances; providing for future review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (11) is added to section 440.185, Florida Statutes, to read:

440.185 Notice of injury or death; reports; penalties for violations.—

- (11) (a) In any notice or report filed with the division pursuant to this section, the personal identifying information of an injured or deceased employee contained in such notice or report is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution.
- (b) Information made confidential and exempt under this subsection may be disclosed by the division only:
- 1. In an aggregate reporting format that does not reveal the personal identifying information of any employee;
 - 2. Pursuant to a court order; or

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3. To an administrative or law enforcement agency in the furtherance of the agency's official duties and responsibilities. An administrative or law enforcement agency receiving such information shall maintain the confidentiality of the information as long as it would otherwise be confidential.

(c) This subsection is subject to the Open Government
Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand
repealed on October 2, 2022, unless reviewed and saved from
repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity to make confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution the personal identifying information of an injured or deceased employee contained in any notice or report filed with the Division of Workers' Compensation of the Department of Financial Services pursuant to s. 440.185, Florida Statutes. Such information filed under the Workers' Compensation Law is of a sensitive, personal nature. Disclosure of such sensitive, personal information about an injured or deceased employee is an invasion of that employee's privacy or the privacy of a deceased employee's family. Further, the release of such information could lead to discrimination against the employee by coworkers, potential employers, and others. The harm caused to such an employee or his or her family by the release of this information outweighs any public benefit derived from its release.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2017.
