Section 1. Section 458.352, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- (1) As used in this section, the term "hair restoration or transplant" means a surgical procedure that removes hair follicles from the body by coring with a hollow punch and removing the tissue or robotic instrument, by removing or dissecting a strip of tissue from the body containing hair follicles that may be dissected off the strip of tissue, or by extracting or removing hair follicles from one location on a living human body, for the purpose of redistributing the hair follicles to another location on the same human body.
