(c) A person issued a specialty license plate that has been discontinued by the department may keep the discontinued specialty license plate for the remainder of the 10 -year license plate replacement period and must pay all other applicable registration fees. However, such person is exempt from paying the applicable specialty license plate fee under subsection (4) for the remainder of the 10 -year license plate replacement period.
(d) If the department discontinues issuance of a specialty license plate, all annual use fees held or collected by the department shall be distributed within 180 days after the date the specialty license plate is discontinued. Of those fees, the department shall retain an amount sufficient to defray the applicable administrative and inventory closeout costs associated with discontinuance of the plate. The remaining funds shall be distributed to the specified organization or organizations as provided in s. 320.08058.
(e) If an organization that is the intended recipient of

the funds pursuant to s. 320.08058 no longer exists, the department shall deposit any undisbursed funds into the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund.
(f) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), on January 1 of each year, the department shall discontinue the specialty license plate with the fewest number of plates in circulation over the previous 24 months. A warning letter shall be mailed to the sponsoring organization following the first month in which the total number of valid specialty license plate registrations is the fewest in circulation over the previous 24 months.
(10) (a) A specialty license plate annual use fee collected and distributed under this chapter, or any interest earned from those fees, may not be used for commercial or for-profit activities nor for general or administrative expenses, except as authorized by s. 320.08058 or to pay the cost of the audit or report required by s. $320.08062(1)$. The fees and any interest earned from the fees may be expended only for use in this state unless the annual use fee is derived from the sale of United States Armed Forces and veterans-related specialty license plates pursuant to paragraphs (4)(d), (bb), (kk), (iii), and (uuu) (ll), (kkk), and (yyy) and s. 320.0891 or out-of-state college or university license plates pursuant to paragraphs (4) (wwww), (b.b.b.b), and (ccccc).

Section 3. Effective October 1, 2020, paragraph (a) of subsection (8) of section 320.08056 , Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
320.08056 Specialty license plates.-
(8) (a) The department must discontinue the issuance of an approved specialty license plate if the number of valid
specialty plate registrations falls below 3,000 1,000 plates for at least 12 consecutive months. A warning letter shall be mailed to the sponsoring organization following the first month in which the total number of valid specialty plate registrations is below 3,000 1,000 plates. This paragraph does not apply to collegiate license plates established under s. 320.08058(3) 上 license plates of institutions in and entities of the State University System, specialty license plates that have statutory eligibility limitations for purchase, or Florida Professional Sports Team License plates established under s. 320.08058(9).

(b) The proceeds from the license plate annual use fee shall be distributed to National Hispanic Corporate Achicvers, Inc., a nomprofit corporation under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, to fund grants to nomprofit organizations to operate programs and provide scholarships and for marketing the Hispanic Achicvers license plate. Thereafter, American Dream Baseball, Inc., may use the proceeds as follows:

1. A maximum of 10 percent may be used for administrative costs of the organization associated with implementing the programs funded by proceeds derived from sales of the specialty license plate and for the promotion and marketing costs of the license plate.

(b) The annual use fees from the plate shall be distributed to the America the Beautiful Fund as follows: 10 percent to offset its administrative, marketing and promotion costs, and the remaining 85 percent for projects and programs teaching character, leadership, and service to Florida youth; provision of well-being and assistance in the military community; outdoor education advancing self-sufficiency; wildlife conservation
including imperiled and managed species; the maintenance of historic or culturally important sites, buildings, structures, or objects, and the development and modification of playgrounds, recreational areas, or other outdoor amenities, including disability access.
(83) PROTECT POLLINATORS PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a Protect Pollinators license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Protect Pollinators" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Florida Wildflower Foundation, Inc., which:
3. May use a maximum of 10 percent of the proceeds to market, promote, and administer the Protect Pollinators plate.
4. Shall use the remainder of the proceeds to establish pollinator wildflower habitats, fund pollinator education and research programs, and promote awareness of pollinators, including butterflies, native bees and honeybees, hummingbirds, bats, and hundreds of other insects and animal pollinator species, and their importance to Florida agricultural success and the security of the food supply.
(84) FLORIDA NATIVE LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a Florida Native license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the word "Native" must appear at the bottom of the plate. The plate must contain a camouflage background that includes leaves, flowers, or fronds of a minimum of 12 different Florida native plants.
(b) 1. The department shall retain all annual use fees from the sale of the plate until all startup costs for developing and issuing the plate have been recovered.
5. Thereafter, the annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Florida Native Plant Society, a Florida nonprofit corporation, which may use a maximum of 10 percent of such fees for administrative costs and to market and promote the plate. The balance of the fees shall be used by Florida Native Plant Society, to fulfill the mission of the Florida Native Plant Society, where 45 percent is dedicated to maintaining, improving, and restoring public native species, hunting and fishing habitats, and 45 percent is used to promote the cultivation of Florida's agricultural products through the preservation of native noncrop plants to provide habitats for pollinators and natural enemies to plant pests, and to provide pollen and nectar and undisturbed habitats for bee nesting throughout the growing season.
(85) DONATE LIFE FLORIDA LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a Donate Life Florida license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Donors Saves Lives" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Donate Life Florida, which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds for marketing and administrative costs. The remaining proceeds of the annual use fees shall be used by the Donate Life Florida to educate Florida residents on the

(91) ALPHA KAPPA ALPHA SORORITY LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop an Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Alpha Kappa Alpha" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Alpha Kappa Alpha Educational Advancement Foundation, Inc., to be used as follows:

3. Five percent shall be used solely for marketing of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority license plate.
4. Ninety-five percent shall be used for college scholarships for residents of the state attending historically black colleges and universities in the state.
(92) ALPHA PHI ALPHA FRATERNITY LICENSE PLATES.-

(a) The department shall develop a Zeta Phi Beta Sorority license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Zeta Phi Beta" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Department of Education to be used for the Mary McLeod Bethune Scholarship Program in accordance with s. 1009.73.
(94) PHI BETA SIGMA FRATERNITY LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity license plate as provided in this section and s.

320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Phi Beta Sigma" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Department of Education to be used for the Mary McLeod Bethune Scholarship Program in accordance with s. 1009.73.
(95) IOTA PHI THETA FRATERNITY LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop an Iota Phi Theta

Fraternity license plate as provided in this section and $s$.
320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Iota Phi Theta" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Department of Education to be used for the Mary McLeod Bethune Scholarship Program in accordance with s. 1009.73.
(96) DAN MARINO FOUNDATION LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a Dan Marino Foundation license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. Dan Marino Foundation license plates must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Marino Campus" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Dan Marino Foundation, Inc., a Florida nonprofit corporation, which may use up to 10 percent of such

fees for administrative costs and marketing of the plate. The remainder of the fees shall be used by the Dan Marino Foundation, Inc., to assist Floridians with developmental disabilities to become employed, independent, and productive, and to promote and fund educational scholarships and awareness of these services.
(97) FLORIDA STATE BEEKEEPERS ASSOCIATION LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a Florida State Beekeepers Association license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Save the Bees" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees shall be distributed to the Florida State Beekeepers Association, a Florida nonprofit corporation. The Florida State Beekeepers Association may use up to 18 percent of the annual use fees for:

1. Direct reimbursement for administrative costs, startup costs, and costs incurred in the development and approval process of the license plate. All vendors associated with the administrative costs shall be selected by competitive bid.
2. Promotion and marketing costs of the license plate.
(c) The remaining funds shall be distributed to the Florida State Beekeepers Association and shall be used to raise awareness of the importance of beekeeping to Florida agriculture by funding honeybee research, education, outreach, and husbandry. (a) The department shall develop an Orlando United license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Orlando United" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed as follows:
3. Seven percent shall be distributed to the Mental Health Association of Central Florida, Inc., to be used for marketing of the license plate.
4. Thirty-one percent shall be distributed to the Mental Health Association of Central Florida, Inc. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for administrative expenses, and the remainder shall be used to offer free personalized counseling to any person affected by the shooting at the Pulse nightclub in Orlando, Florida, on June 12, 2016.
5. Thirty-one percent shall be distributed to the Hispanic Federation, Inc., a charitable, not-for-profit organization under s. 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code registered with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and incorporated in New York. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be used for administrative expenses, and the remainder shall be used to offer free personalized counseling to any person affected by the shooting at the Pulse nightclub in Orlando, Florida, on June 12, 2016, through the Proyecto Somos Orlando campaign operated by the Hispanic Federation, Inc.
6. Thirty-one percent shall be distributed to Two Spirit Health Services, Inc. Of this amount, up to 5 percent may be
used for administrative expenses, and the remainder shall be used to offer free personalized counseling to any person affected by the shooting at the Pulse nightclub in Orlando, Florida, on June 12, 2016.
(99) ETHICAL ECOTOURISM LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop an Ethical Ecotourism license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and words that are approved by the department must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed equally between the Florida Society for Ethical Ecotourism and Paddle Florida, Inc., each of which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds for administrative costs and marketing of the plate. The balance of the annual use fees shall be used by the Florida Society for Ethical Ecotourism to provide environmental education and awareness that encourages behaviors that contribute to the sustainability of Florida's natural ecosystems and resources and Paddle Florida, Inc., to raise awareness about water conservation, wildlife preservation, restoration of springs, and protection of waterways in this state.

(b) The Tampa Bay Auburn Club is the lead club on behalf of the Auburn clubs in this state. The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Tampa Bay Auburn Club, together with statistics on sales of the license plates tabulated by county. The Tampa Bay Auburn Club must distribute to each of the state's Auburn clubs on a pro-rata basis the moneys received from sales in the regions within the respective club's area for the purpose of awarding scholarships to Florida residents attending Auburn University. Students receiving these scholarships must be eligible for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program pursuant to s. 1009.531 and shall use the

scholarship funds for tuition and other expenses related to attending Auburn University.
(102) BEAT CHILDHOOD CANCER LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a Beat Childhood Cancer license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Beat Childhood Cancer" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Beat Nb, Inc., which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds for administrative costs directly associated with the operation of the corporation and for marketing and promoting the plate. The remaining proceeds shall be used by the corporation to fund pediatric cancer treatment and research.
(103) AMERICAN EAGLE LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop an American Eagle license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "God Bless America" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the American Eagle Foundation for deposit in the foundation's national endowment fund. Up to 10 percent of the funds received may be used for administrative costs and marketing of the plate. The American Eagle Foundation shall use the remainder of the proceeds to fund public education programs, rescue and care programs, and other conservation efforts in


Florida which benefit bald eagles.
(104) FLORIDA BAY FOREVER LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a Florida Bay Forever
license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Florida Bay Forever" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Florida National Park Association, Inc., which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds for administrative costs and marketing of the plate. The remainder of the funds shall be used to supplement the Everglades National Park's budgets and to support educational, interpretive, historical, and scientific research relating to the Everglades National Park.
(105) BONEFISH AND TARPON TRUST LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a Bonefish and Tarpon Trust license plate as provided in this section. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Bonefish and Tarpon Trust" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Bonefish and Tarpon Trust, which:

1. May use a maximum of 10 percent of the proceeds to promote and market the Bonefish and Tarpon Trust license plate.
2. Shall invest and reinvest the remainder of the proceeds and use the interest thereon to conserve and enhance Florida bonefish and tarpon fisheries and their respective environments

through stewardship, research, education, and advocacy.
(106) UNIVERSITY OF GEORGIA LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a University of Georgia license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "The University of Georgia" must appear at the bottom of the plate.
(b) The Georgia Bulldog Club of Jacksonville is the lead club on behalf of the University of Georgia Booster Clubs in this state. The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to the Georgia Bulldog Club of Jacksonville, together with statistics on sales of the license plates tabulated by county. The Georgia Bulldog Club of Jacksonville must distribute to each of the state's University of Georgia Booster Clubs on a pro-rata basis the moneys received from sales in the regions within the respective club's area for the purpose of awarding scholarships to Florida residents attending the University of Georgia. Students receiving these scholarships must be eligible for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program pursuant to s. 1009.531 and shall use the scholarship funds for tuition and other expenses related to attending the University of Georgia.
(107) UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA LICENSE PLATES.-
(a) The department shall develop a University of Alabama license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the words "Roll Tide" must appear at the bottom of
the plate.
(b) Bama Orlando of Orlando is the lead club on behalf of the University of Alabama State Alumni Association in this state. The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Bama Orlando of Orlando, together with statistics on sales of the license plates tabulated by county. Bama Orlando of Orlando must distribute to each of the state's University of Alabama Booster Clubs on a pro-rata basis the moneys received from sales in the regions within the respective club's area for the purpose of awarding scholarships to Florida residents attending the University of Alabama. Students receiving these scholarships must be eligible for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program pursuant to s. 1009.531 and shall use the scholarship funds for tuition and other expenses related to attending the University of Alabama.
