A bill to be entitled

An act relating to electromagnetic pulse preparedness; providing definitions; requiring the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability to submit a report of its recommendations to the Governor and Legislature by a specified date; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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- Section 1. Electromagnetic pulse preparedness.-
- (1) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Electric utility" means an electric utility as defined in s. 366.02, Florida Statutes.
- (b) "Electromagnetic pulse" means a high intensity burst of electromagnetic radiation generated by the detonation of a nuclear weapon at an altitude of 18 miles or higher. The term also means a high intensity burst of electromagnetic energy caused by solar activity.
- (2) REPORT.—The Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability shall submit a report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by December 31, 2018, that:
- (a) Recommends a state agency to act as the controlling authority for the state on issues concerning electromagnetic pulse events.
- (b) Recommends a process to identify potential vulnerabilities to the electric power grid which could result from an electromagnetic pulse event.

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(c) Recommends a process to correct any vulnerabilities that are determined to exist.

- (d) Recommends a method to ensure cost recovery for electric utilities that retrofit existing systems and implement measures to protect against vulnerabilities.
- (e) Provides recommendations to ensure the availability of replacement equipment that may be needed after an electromagnetic pulse event.
- (f) Recommends a process to identify other critical facilities, including defense facilities, that may be vulnerable to an electromagnetic pulse event.
- (g) Recommends a process to share timely information between state, regional, and local governments; electric utilities; and private entities.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2018.
