- 3. An agency that is the custodian of the information specified in subparagraph 2. and that is not the employer of the officer, employee, justice, judge, or other person specified in subparagraph 2. shall maintain the exempt status of that information only if the officer, employee, justice, judge, other person, or employing agency of the designated employee submits a written request for maintenance of the exemption to the custodial agency.
- 4. The exemptions in this paragraph apply to information held by an agency before, on, or after the effective date of the exemption.
- Section 2. (1) The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that the following identifying and location information be exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution:
- (a) The home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and photographs of current or former directors, managers,

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supervisors, and clinical employees of a child advocacy center that meets the requirements of s. 39.3035, Florida Statutes.

- (b) The home addresses, telephone numbers, dates of birth, and photographs of current or former members of a child protection team as provided in s. 39.303, Florida Statutes, whose duties include supporting the investigation of child abuse or sexual abuse, child abandonment, child neglect, or child exploitation or to provide services as part of a multidisciplinary case review team.
- (c) The home addresses, telephone numbers, photographs, dates of birth, and places of employment of the spouses and children of personnel identified in paragraphs (a) and (b).
- (d) The names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of such personnel.
