10	Section 1. Subsection (13) of section 465.003, Florida
11	Statutes, is amended to read:
12	465.003 DefinitionsAs used in this chapter, the term:
13	(13) "Practice of the profession of pharmacy" includes
14	compounding, dispensing, and consulting concerning contents,
15	therapeutic values, and uses of any medicinal drug; consulting
16	concerning therapeutic values and interactions of patent or
17	proprietary preparations, whether pursuant to prescriptions or
18	in the absence and entirely independent of such prescriptions or
19	orders; and other pharmaceutical services. For purposes of this
20	subsection, "other pharmaceutical services" means the monitoring
21	of the patient's drug therapy and assisting the patient in the
22	management of his or her drug therapy, and includes review and
23	recommendations made pursuant to of the patient's drug therapy
24	and communication with the patient's prescribing health care
25	provider as licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter

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461, or chapter 466, or similar statutory provision in another 26 27 jurisdiction, or such provider's agent or such other persons as 28 specifically authorized by the patient, regarding the patient's 29 drug therapy and health care status. However, nothing in this 30 subsection may be interpreted to permit an alteration of a 31 prescriber's directions, the diagnosis or treatment of any 32 disease, the initiation of any drug therapy, the practice of 33 medicine, or the practice of osteopathic medicine, unless otherwise permitted by law. "Practice of the profession of 34 35 pharmacy" also includes any other act, service, operation, research, or transaction incidental to, or forming a part of, 36 37 any of the foregoing acts, requiring, involving, or employing the science or art of any branch of the pharmaceutical 38 39 profession, study, or training, and shall expressly permit a pharmacist to transmit information from persons authorized to 40 prescribe medicinal drugs to their patients. The practice of the 41 42 profession of pharmacy also includes the administration of 43 vaccines to adults pursuant to s. 465.189. The practice of the 44 profession of pharmacy also includes the ordering and evaluating 45 of any laboratory or clinical testing, conducting patient 46 assessments, and administering, initiating, modifying, or discontinuing medicinal drugs pursuant to s. 465.0125. 47 48 Section 2. Section 465.0125, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 49 50 465.0125 Consultant pharmacist license; application,

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51 renewal, fees; responsibilities; rules.-

52 The department shall issue or renew a consultant (1)53 pharmacist license upon receipt of an initial or renewal 54 application which conforms to the requirements for consultant 55 pharmacist initial licensure or renewal as promulgated by the 56 board by rule and a fee set by the board not to exceed \$250. In 57 order to be licensed as a consultant pharmacist, a pharmacist 58 licensed under this chapter must complete additional training as 59 required by the board. 60 (a) A consultant pharmacist may provide comprehensive

61 medication management services within collaborative practice 62 agreements between such pharmacist and a health care facility 63 medical director or individual health care practitioner 64 authorized by law, or similar statutory provision in another 65 jurisdiction, to prescribe medicinal drugs. Such services may 66 include: 67 1. Ordering and evaluating any laboratory or clinical 68 testing for the promotion and evaluation of patient health and 69 wellness, and monitoring medication therapy and treatment 70 outcomes. 71 2. Conducting patient assessments, as appropriate, to 72 evaluate and monitor drug therapy.

73 <u>3. Initiating, modifying, or discontinuing medicinal drugs</u>
74 <u>as outlined in the agreed upon patient-specific order or</u>

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76	4. Administering medicinal drugs.
77	<u>(b) A</u> The consultant pharmacist <u>is</u> shall be responsible
78	for maintaining all drug, patient care, and quality assurance
79	records as required by law. A consultant pharmacist, along with
80	a collaborating practitioner, is also responsible for
81	maintaining collaborative practice agreements and making such
82	agreements available upon request or inspection records required
83	by law and for establishing drug handling procedures for the
84	safe handling and storage of drugs. The consultant pharmacist
85	may also be responsible for ordering and evaluating any
86	laboratory or clinical testing when, in the judgment of the
87	consultant pharmacist, such activity is necessary for the proper
88	performance of the consultant pharmacist's responsibilities.
89	Such laboratory or clinical testing may be ordered only with
90	regard to patients residing in a nursing home facility, and then
91	only when authorized by the medical director of the nursing home
92	facility. The consultant pharmacist must have completed such
93	additional training and demonstrate such additional
94	qualifications in the practice of institutional pharmacy as
95	shall be required by the board in addition to licensure as a
96	registered pharmacist.
97	(2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1), a
98	consultant pharmacist or a doctor of pharmacy licensed in this
99	state may also be responsible for ordering and evaluating any
100	laboratory or clinical testing for persons under the care of a
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101	licensed home health agency when, in the judgment of the
102	consultant pharmacist or doctor of pharmacy, such activity is
103	necessary for the proper performance of his or her
104	responsibilities and only when authorized by a practitioner
105	licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 461, or chapter
106	466. In order for the consultant pharmacist or doctor of
107	pharmacy to qualify and accept this authority, he or she must
108	receive 3 hours of continuing education relating to laboratory
109	and clinical testing as established by the board.
110	(2)-(3) The board shall promulgate rules necessary to
111	implement and administer this section.
