61 However, if the property is stolen within a county that is  
62 subject to a state of emergency declared by the Governor under  
63 chapter 252, the property is stolen after the declaration of  
64 emergency is made, and the perpetration of the theft is  
65 facilitated by conditions arising from the emergency, the  
66 offender commits a felony of the second degree, punishable as  
67 provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084, if the  
68 property is valued at \$5,000 or more, but less than \$10,000, as  
69 provided under subparagraph 2., or if the property is valued at  
70 \$10,000 or more, but less than \$20,000, as provided under  
71 subparagraph 3. As used in this paragraph, the term "conditions  
72 arising from the emergency" means civil unrest, power outages,  
73 curfews, voluntary or mandatory evacuations, or a reduction in  
74 the presence of or the response time for first responders or  
75 homeland security personnel. For purposes of sentencing under

76 chapter 921, a felony offense that is reclassified under this  
 77 paragraph is ranked one level above the ranking under s.  
 78 921.0022 or s. 921.0023 of the offense committed.

79 (d) It is grand theft of the third degree and a felony of  
 80 the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s.  
 81 775.083, or s. 775.084, if the property stolen is valued at

110 calculate the thresholds, rounded to the nearest \$50, and  
111 publish the amounts, as adjusted, on its website by July 1 of

113 office shall certify the revised amounts to the Division of Law  
114 Revision and Information, which is directed to conform the
