A bill to be entitled

An act relating to contraband in county detention facilities; amending s. 951.22, F.S.; prohibiting introduction into or possession on the grounds of any county detention facility of any cellular telephone or other portable communication device; defining the term "portable communication device"; providing criminal penalties; amending s. 921.0022, F.S.; conforming provisions to changes made by the act; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 951.22, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- 951.22 County detention facilities; contraband articles.-
- (1) It is unlawful, except through regular channels as duly authorized by the sheriff or officer in charge, to introduce into or possess upon the grounds of any county detention facility as defined in s. 951.23 or to give to or receive from any inmate of any such facility wherever said inmate is located at the time or to take or to attempt to take or send therefrom any of the following articles which are hereby declared to be contraband:
  - (a) for the purposes of this act, to wit: Any written or

data, or connect electronically to the Internet or any other electronic device and which allows communications in any form.

Such devices include, but are not limited to, portable two-way pagers, hand-held radios, cellular telephones, Blackberry-type devices, personal digital assistants or PDA's, laptop computers, or any components of these devices which are intended to be used to assemble such devices. The term also includes any new technology that is developed for similar purposes. Excluded from this definition is any device having communication capabilities which has been approved or issued by the sheriff or the officer in charge for investigative or institutional security purposes or for conducting other official business.

- (2) A person who Whoever violates paragraph (1)(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), or (g) commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. A person who violates paragraph (1)(h), (i), (j), or (k) commits subsection (1) shall be guilty of a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
- Section 2. Paragraph (f) of subsection (3) of section 921.0022, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
