21	has secured a community pharmacy permit from the department.

23	this state may dispense up to a <u>48-hour</u> 24-hour supply of a
24	medicinal drug to any patient of, or patient discharged from, an
25	emergency department of a hospital that operates a Class II or
26	Class III institutional pharmacy, provided that the physician
