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3-00826B-19 20191256 30 From these funds, \$32 million shall be distributed each fiscal 31 year through the 2023-2024 fiscal year to the South Florida 32 Water Management District for the Long-Term Plan as defined in 33 s. 373.4592(2). After deducting the \$32 million distributed 34 under this subparagraph, from the funds remaining, a minimum of the lesser of 76.5 percent or \$100 million shall be appropriated 35 36 each fiscal year through the 2025-2026 fiscal year for the 37 planning, design, engineering, and construction of the 38 Comprehensive Everglades Restoration Plan as set forth in s. 39 373.470, including the Central Everglades Planning Project, the 40 Everglades Agricultural Area Storage Reservoir Project, the Lake Okeechobee Watershed Project, the C-43 West Basin Storage 41 42 Reservoir Project, the Indian River Lagoon-South Project, the 43 Western Everglades Restoration Project, and the Picayune Strand 44 Restoration Project. The Department of Environmental Protection 45 and the South Florida Water Management District shall give 46 preference to those Everglades restoration projects that reduce harmful discharges of water from Lake Okeechobee to the St. 47 48 Lucie or Caloosahatchee estuaries in a timely manner. For the 49 purpose of performing the calculation provided in this subparagraph, the amount of debt service paid pursuant to 50 51 paragraph (a) for bonds issued after July 1, 2016, for the 52 purposes set forth under paragraph (b) shall be added to the 53 amount remaining after the payments required under paragraph (a). The amount of the distribution calculated shall then be 54 reduced by an amount equal to the debt service paid pursuant to 55 56 paragraph (a) on bonds issued after July 1, 2016, for the 57 purposes set forth under this subparagraph.

For the purpose of 61 performing the calculation provided in this subparagraph, the 62 amount of debt service paid pursuant to paragraph (a) for bonds 63 issued after July 1, 2016, for the purposes set forth under paragraph (b) shall be added to the amount remaining after the 64 65 payments required under paragraph (a). The amount of the 66 distribution calculated shall then be reduced by an amount equal 67 to the debt service paid pursuant to paragraph (a) on bonds 68 issued after July 1, 2016, for the purposes set forth under this 69 subparagraph.

3. The sum of \$5 million shall be appropriated annually each fiscal year through the 2025-2026 fiscal year to the St. Johns River Water Management District for projects dedicated to the restoration of Lake Apopka. This distribution shall be reduced by an amount equal to the debt service paid pursuant to paragraph (a) on bonds issued after July 1, 2016, for the purposes set forth in this subparagraph.

The sum of \$64 million is appropriated and shall be 78 transferred to the Everglades Trust Fund for the 2018-2019 fiscal year, and each fiscal year thereafter, for the EAA 79 80 reservoir project pursuant to s. 373.4598. Any funds remaining 81 in any fiscal year shall be made available only for Phase II of 82 the C-51 reservoir project or projects identified in 83 subparagraph 1. and must be used in accordance with laws relating to such projects. 101	and disposal facilities; the installation of onsite sewage
102	treatment and disposal systems; direct and indirect potable
103	reuse; and other water quality and water supply projects. At
104	least 25 percent of the appropriated funds shall be spent on
