A bill to be entitled

An act relating to election security measures; creating s. 101.5617, F.S.; prohibiting the use of electronic poll books that are not approved by the Department of State beginning with the 2022 primary election; requiring the department to adopt rules that meet certain minimum criteria; defining the term "risk-limiting audit"; establishing the risk-limiting audit pilot program to be administered by the department; requiring a participating county to submit a report to the department following completion of the audit; requiring the department to submit a report to the Governor and the Legislature by a specified date; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 101.5617, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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101.5617 Electronic poll book approval.

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election thereafter, an electronic poll book may not be used as a precinct register unless it is approved for such use by the department.

(1) Beginning with the 2022 primary election and each

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(2) The department shall adopt rules for the approval of an electronic poll book which provide that the electronic poll book, at a minimum, must:

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(a) Be secure from unauthorized intrusion.

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(b) Contain all information required to be included in a

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precinct register under s. 98.461(2).

- (c) Be compatible with the statewide voter registration system and securely transmit changes to a voter's voting history to the voter registration system.
- (d) Be compatible with a form or device provided by the supervisor to capture an elector's signature in accordance with s. 101.5608(1).

Section 2. Risk-limiting audit pilot program.-

- (1) As used in this section, the term "risk-limiting audit" means an audit protocol that makes use of statistical methods to manually check a sample of ballots or voter-verifiable paper output from a voter interface device and is designed to limit to acceptable levels the risk of certifying a preliminary election outcome that constitutes an incorrect outcome.
- (2) The Department of State shall conduct a pilot program for the 2020 general election to assess the effectiveness of risk-limiting audits as opposed to the post-election auditing methods provided under existing law. In consultation with the Florida State Association of Supervisors of Elections, the department shall designate at least five but not more than seven counties for participation in the pilot program. To the extent possible, the department shall endeavor to select counties of varying sizes that use various voting systems for participation in the pilot program is voluntary.
- (3) A county that participates in the pilot program shall conduct a public risk-limiting audit following completion of the voting system audit required under s. 101.591, Florida Statutes. Within 15 days after completion of the risk-limiting audit, the

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supervisor of elections of a participating county shall submit a report to the Department of State detailing the results of the risk-limiting audit and the procedures and methods followed in conducting the audit.

(4) By October 1, 2021, the Department of State shall submit a report detailing the results of the pilot program to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chairs of the legislative committees having jurisdiction over election law. Additionally, the report must address the effectiveness and efficiency of the risk-limiting audit as compared with the audits conducted in the same election pursuant to s. 101.591, Florida Statutes.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
