An act relating to climate fiscal responsibility; creating s. 216.139, F.S.; requiring the Economic Estimating Conference to annually prepare a climate fiscal responsibility report and provide a copy of the report to the Governor and the Legislature; requiring the Office of Economic and Demographic Research to publish the report on its website; specifying requirements for the report; requiring the conference to coordinate with and obtain data from certain entities in preparing the report; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 216.139, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

216.139 Economic Estimating Conference; annual climate fiscal responsibility report.—

(1) By January 1, 2021, and January 1 of each year thereafter, the Economic Estimating Conference shall prepare a climate fiscal responsibility report and provide a copy of the report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Office of Economic and Demographic Research shall publish the report on its website. The report must contain all of the following:

(a) An analysis of the estimated impact of climate change on the state's general obligation credit rating, debt capacity, and tax base associated with:

1. The increased frequency and intensity of natural disasters such as wildfires, hurricanes, and droughts over the next 10 fiscal years; and

- 2. Long-term trends, including sea level rise and changes in global temperature.
- (b) Recommendations for immediate action and action to be taken over the next 5 years, 10 years, and 20 years, respectively.
- (2) In preparing the report, the Economic Estimating

 Conference shall coordinate with and obtain data from the

 Division of Bond Finance, the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund

 Advisory Council, the Florida Commission on Hurricane Loss

 Projection Methodology, the Office of Economic and Demographic

 Research, and the Department of Revenue and other state

 agencies.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2020.
