I.Amendments Contained in Message:

House Amendment 1 - 541211 (with body and title).

II.Summary of Amendments Contained in Message:

House Amendment 1: The amendment removes the following provisions from the bill:

- A requirement that specific medical professionals complete two hours of continuing education courses in suicide prevention;
- New training and staffing requirements related to suicide prevention and the use of suicide risk assessment screening tools for instructional personnel at public and charter schools;
- A provision granting civil immunity to persons who help or attempt to help others at imminent risk of suicide; and
- A provision directing the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) to review other states' suicide prevention programs and submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature.
- An appropriation of \$418,036 in recurring funds and \$8,896 in nonrecurring funds from the General Revenue Fund.
