- 5. A representative of organizations in this state which provide care or other support to individuals with rare diseases.

Any vacancy on the advisory council must be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.

(3) The initial members of the advisory council must be appointed by September 1, 2021. Each member must be appointed to a 4-year term of office. However, in order to achieve staggered terms, each of the initial members appointed pursuant to paragraph (2)(a) must be appointed to a 2-year term. The

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
