- 4. Maintain a public display recognizing service members, veterans, or military students and families.
- 5. Engage all students and staff in a project connecting the school with the military community, such as adopt-a-school or a letters and care package collection for troops.
- 6. Provide outreach for military parents and their children to connect with, and feel supported by, the surrounding community, such as relief funds for struggling military students; college scholarship opportunities financed by local businesses; cooperative community and school projects; structures to provide parents with community resource information and contacts; and family activities on nonsecure areas of military bases, such as STEM or literacy activities.
- 7. Publish a welcome video or photo slideshow on the school's website to highlight certain aspects of the school facility, such as the gym, cafeteria, media center, a typical classroom, and playground, as a way to help military students transitioning to the area.
- 8. For middle schools and high schools, offer a Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps program and allow military students to participate upon arrival to the school.
 - (3) A school may partner with a school district to procure
