Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 918.13, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- Tampering with or fabricating physical evidence. -918.13
- It is unlawful for any No person, knowing that a criminal trial, or proceeding, or an investigation by a duly constituted prosecuting authority, law enforcement agency, grand jury or legislative committee of this state is pending or is about to be instituted, to shall:
- Alter, destroy, conceal, or remove any record, document, or other item thing with the purpose to impair its verity or availability in such proceeding or investigation; or
- Make, present, or use any record, document, or other item thing, knowing it to be false.
