Consistent with the American Psychological 81 82 Association's established policies for education of 83 psychologists in preparation for prescriptive authority, the 84 successful completion of an organized sequence of study in a 85 program offering intensive didactic education which includes 86 core areas of instruction in basic sciences, neurosciences, 87 physical examination, interpretation of laboratory tests, pathological bases of disease, clinical medicine, clinical 88 89 neurotherapeutics, systems of care, pharmacology, clinical 90 pharmacology, psychopharmacology, psychopharmacology research, 91 and professional, ethical, and legal issues.
