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The Committee on Rules (Rodriguez) recommended the following:

## Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

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Between lines 1283 and 1284 insert:

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Section 18. Present subsections (6) through (11) of section 465.1895, Florida Statutes, are redesignated as subsections (7) through (12), respectively, a new subsection (6) is added to that section, and subsection (1) and paragraph (b) of subsection (5) of that section are amended, to read:

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465.1895 Testing or screening for and treatment of minor, nonchronic health conditions.-



- (1) A pharmacist may test or screen for and treat minor, nonchronic health conditions within the framework of an established written protocol with a supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 or a standard protocol adopted in rule by the board in consultation with the Board of Medicine and the Board of Osteopathic Medicine. For purposes of this section, a minor, nonchronic health condition is typically a short-term condition that is generally managed with minimal treatment or self-care, and includes:
  - (a) Influenza.
  - (b) Streptococcus.
  - (c) Lice.

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- (d) Skin conditions, such as ringworm and athlete's foot.
- (e) Minor, uncomplicated infections.
- (5) The written protocol between a pharmacist and supervising physician under this subsection must include particular terms and conditions imposed by the supervising physician relating to the testing and screening for and treatment of minor, nonchronic health conditions under this section. The terms and conditions must be appropriate to the pharmacist's training. A pharmacist who enters into such a protocol with a supervising physician must submit the protocol to the board.
- (b) A pharmacist authorized to test and screen for and treat minor, nonchronic conditions under a supervising physician protocol shall provide evidence of current certification by the board to the supervising physician. A supervising physician shall review the pharmacist's actions in accordance with the protocol.

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- (6) In lieu of entering into a protocol with a supervising physician under subsection (5), a pharmacist may test or screen for and treat minor, nonchronic health conditions under a standard protocol adopted in rule by the board in consultation with the Board of Medicine and the Board of Osteopathic Medicine. A pharmacist testing or screening for and treating minor, nonchronic health conditions under the standard protocol must submit a signed copy of the standard protocol to the board. At a minimum, the standard protocol shall include:
- (a) Specific categories of patients whom the pharmacist is authorized to test or screen for and treat minor, nonchronic health conditions.
- (b) Instructions for obtaining relevant patient medical history for the purpose of identifying disqualifying health conditions, adverse reactions, and contraindications to the approved course of treatment.
- (c) Instructions for the treatment of minor, nonchronic health conditions based on the patient's age, symptoms, and test results, including negative results.
- (d) Any other requirements as established by the board in consultation with the Board of Medicine and the Board of Osteopathic Medicine.
