(1) As used in this section, the term:

- (a) "Medically tailored groceries" means a program

 prescribed by a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter

 459 for family-sized sets of fresh and healthful groceries

 purchased and distributed with education and support to change
 eating habits which:
- 1. Are in a protocol standard selected by a dietitian or nutritionist licensed under s. 468.513 as part of a 6-month intervention treatment program that includes, at a minimum, behavioral health counseling, nutrition education, Food is Medicine functional medicine classes, anatomy of disease classes, cooking classes, weekly menus and shopping lists, exercise classes, and supports for habit changes such as peer mentoring and health coaching over for a Medicaid recipient for a specific disease or condition to effectively control and reverse disease effects.
- 2. May be picked up at an event organized by the program or by an entity under contract with the program or may be delivered by the program or by an entity under contract with the program to the residence of the Medicaid recipient.
- 3. May include healthful prepared ingredients, herbs, spices, sauces, at-home lab tests, supplements, or telehealth

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components.

- (b) "Medically tailored meals" means meals that are:
- 1. Provided through a referral from a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459.
- 2. Designed and approved by a dietitian or nutritionist licensed under s. 468.513 to reflect appropriate medical nutrition therapy based on the latest evidence-based practice guidelines for the medical condition or disease that requires the referral provided in subparagraph 1.
- 3. Fully prepared by a Medicaid provider or by a person or entity under contract with a Medicaid provider.
- 4. Delivered to the residence of the Medicaid recipient
 living with the medical condition or disease for which the meals
 are designed to control or reverse the disease effects and
 reduce high-cost health care utilization of the enrolled patient
 while improving the quality of life and increasing the lifespan
 of the patient.
- (c) "Produce prescription" means a program that is prescribed by a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 to a Medicaid recipient who has or is at risk of a dietrelated disease or condition, such as diabetes, coronary heart disease, cancer, obesity, renal disease, asthma, or dementia, to consume fresh produce by offering incentives for fresh produce purchases by using a voucher or debit card for free or discounted fresh produce.

1. The voucher or debit card may be redeemed at a farm store, a farm packing house, a mobile farmers' market, or a market as defined in s. 414.456; through delivery to a supermarket or a grocery store; or through a Medicaid provider.

- 2. The fresh produce in the program are in a protocol standard selected by a dietitian or nutritionist licensed under s. 468.513 as part of a treatment program that may include behavioral health counseling, nutrition education, Food is Medicine functional medicine classes, anatomy of disease classes, gym or exercise classes, weekly menus and shopping lists, grocery store tours, and habit change supports such as peer mentoring and health coaching for a Medicaid recipient for a specific disease or condition to effectively control and reverse disease effects.
- (2) By July 1, 2024, the Agency for Health Care

 Administration, in conjunction with the Department of Health,

 shall:
- (a) Establish the Food Is Medicine Program to provide

 Medicaid coverage for purchases and deliveries of prescribed

 healthful foods in disease-specific protocols through medically
 tailored groceries, medically tailored meals, and produce

 prescription programs to meet the specific needs of Medicaid
 recipients who have or who are at risk of a diet-related disease
 or condition and who are high-need patients or patients with
 high-cost patient care or with the highest healthcare

utilization. The program serves to establish the impact of healthful foods on health outcomes of Medicaid recipients and the cost effectiveness of such evidence-based practices.

(b) Seek:

- 1. The program's approval by the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services under s. 1115 of the Social Security Act, which gives the secretary the authority to approve experimental, pilot, or demonstration projects that are likely to assist in promoting the objectives of the Medicaid program.
- 2. Any federal waivers necessary for the implementation of the program, including any waivers necessary to obtain federal financial to secure Title XIX matching funds for the program.

 The federal waiver application shall seek Medicaid matching funds for all general revenue, family contributions, and local contributions.
 - (c) Adopt rules that include, but are not limited to:
- 1. The quality standard and quantity and the number of medically tailored meals delivered per week to a Medicaid recipient.
- 2. The moneys allowed per Medicaid recipient for medically tailored groceries or for a produce prescription program.
- 3. Notification to Medicaid providers and Medicaid recipients of the availability of and requirements for medically tailored meals, medically tailored groceries, and produce prescription programs.
