Paragraph (h) is added to subsection (1) of 24 section 1009.25, Florida Statutes, to read:

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1009.25 Fee exemptions.

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(1) The following students are exempt from the payment of tuition and fees, including lab fees, at a school district that provides workforce education programs, Florida College System institution, or state university:

- (h) Beginning with a female student who has a conception date of January 1, 2023, or thereafter, a female student who is pregnant as a result of rape, incest, domestic violence, or human trafficking, who decides to carry the pregnancy to term, and whose household income level does not exceed 185 percent of the federal poverty level. The State Board of Education may adopt rules and the Board of Governors may adopt regulations regarding documentation and procedures to implement this paragraph.
- Section 2. Section 1009.8963, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

Mho Are Victims of Sexual Abuse Grant Program.—There is established within the Department of Education the Academic Success of Pregnant Female Students Who Are Victims of Sexual Abuse Grant Program. The purpose of the program is to provide funds for child care for low-income, female students who are pregnant as a result of rape, incest, domestic violence, or human trafficking and who decide to carry the pregnancy to term.

- (1) A student is eligible for the program if she:
- (a) Is pregnant as a result of rape, incest, domestic

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violence, or hu	ıman trafficking;	has a conception	date of January
1, 2023, or the	reafter; and deci	des to carry the	pregnancy to
term.			

- (b) Has a household income level that does not exceed 185 percent of the federal poverty level.
- (c) Is a Florida resident as described in s. 1009.40 and rules of the State Board of Education.
- (d) Is enrolled at a school district career center, charter career technical center, Florida College System institution, or state university.
- (2) (a) Subject to legislative appropriation, the department shall award grants to eligible students on a first-come, first-served basis.
- (b) The amount of a grant award shall be the average cost of a child care provider that holds a Gold Seal Quality Care designation under s. 1002.945 for the county in which the eligible student resides.
- (c) The department shall disburse grant awards to eligible students at the beginning of the fall and spring semesters.
- (3) The State Board of Education may adopt rules to implement this section.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.

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
