Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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26 27 Section 1. This act may be cited as the "HeartCharged 28 Act." 29 Section 2. Section 1003.457, Florida Statutes, is created 30 to read: 31 1003.457 Automated external defibrillators on school grounds; emergency action plan; provision of information .-32 33 (1) In addition to the requirements of s. 1006.165, each 34 public school, including each charter school, and private school 35 must have at least one operational automated external 36 defibrillator on school grounds. Each defibrillator must be 37 stored in a location that is easily accessible to anyone at any 38 time during the school day and any other time students are on 39 school grounds, including outside of the school year. Each 40 defibrillator must have appropriate accompanying signage, 41 including, but not limited to, signage at the defibrillator's 42 exact location and which directs responders to the building or 43 room where the defibrillator is routinely kept. Each 44 defibrillator and its accompanying pads, including pediatric pads when necessitated, and rescue kit, must be maintained 45 46 according to the manufacturer's instructions and kept in usable 47 condition. By July 1, 2025, each school must have a sufficient 48 number of defibrillators to allow a person to retrieve a 49 defibrillator within 3 minutes after a cardiac or medical 50 emergency in which the use of a defibrillator is needed anywhere

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on school grounds during a school day. Each school is encouraged to form public and private partnerships and seek grants, gifts, and other donations to cover the costs associated with the purchase, placement, and training in the use of the defibrillator.

- (2) Each school shall create an emergency action plan for responding to cardiac and medical emergencies that necessitate the use of a defibrillator or cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The plan must, at a minimum:
- (a) Designate at least one person as a response leader who
  shall:
  - 1. Oversee the implementation of the plan.

- 2. Form a response team to respond to cardiac and medical emergencies.
- 3. Ensure that the school has employees trained to respond to cardiac or medical emergencies.
- 4. Be responsible for finalizing the school's initial plan.
- 5. Be responsible for collecting and processing feedback and updating the school's plan, as necessary. The school's plan must be evaluated and, if necessary, updated after any cardiac emergency drill or cardiac or medical emergency which required the use of a defibrillator at the school.
- 6. Work toward having enough defibrillators to allow a person to retrieve a defibrillator within 3 minutes after a

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cardiac or medical emergency in which a defibrillator is needed.

- 7. Form a response committee to assist in the duties of the response leader and ensure compliance with the training requirements of this section. The response committee must meet at least once a year or more frequently when necessary to discharge its duties. The response committee must be composed of at least five persons who agree to work toward better outcomes in cardiac events, including:
  - a. The response leader.

- b. For a public school, a safe-school officer, who must also be trained yearly in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of a defibrillator and know the location of each defibrillator on school grounds.
  - c. A student currently enrolled at the school.
  - d. A parent of a student currently enrolled at the school.
  - e. A classroom teacher at the school.
- (b) Include a list of at least five school employees who are certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and trained in the use of a defibrillator.
- (c) Include detailed procedures for responding to a cardiac or medical emergency, including acknowledging that in such an emergency it is crucial that emergency services be called, quality cardiopulmonary resuscitation be administered, and a defibrillator be retrieved as quickly as possible. A person must be selected to be responsible for such actions and

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must be prepared to perform such responsibilities as needed to ensure such tasks are completed. The plan must also communicate that other persons should not be deterred from performing such actions as quickly as possible if the selected person is not immediately available. The detailed procedures must identify the person who will:

- 1. Respond to the cardiac or medical emergency in which cardiopulmonary resuscitation or a defibrillator is needed, ensuring the administration of cardiopulmonary resuscitation.
- 2. Respond to the cardiac or medical emergency in which cardiopulmonary resuscitation or a defibrillator is needed, ensuring the retrieval and use of a defibrillator.
  - 3. Communicate with emergency medical services.
  - 4. Communicate with school personnel.

- 5. Assist emergency medical services in locating the person experiencing the cardiac or medical emergency.
- (d) Establish a schedule for at least one drill each semester of the school year in which the appropriate staff practices the implementation of the emergency plan. At least once each school year, a drill required under this paragraph must create a scenario of a student suffering from sudden cardiac arrest and include the entire school, including both students and school employees.
- (3) Each school shall provide students, parents, and school employees with information, either electronically or

127	(a) Cardiac emergencies, including what a cardiac
128	emergency may look like and how to respond to such an emergency,
129	including when such emergency happens to a student, general
130	information about cardiopulmonary resuscitation and how to
131	operate a defibrillator, and the warning signs of a cardiac
132	condition in young people. A school may provide official
133	training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of a
