**Amendment (with title amendment)**

Between lines 250 and 251, insert:

Section 4. Paragraph (b) of subsection (3) and subsection (4) of section 1003.64, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

1003.64 Community School Grant Program.—It is the intent of the Legislature to improve student success and well-being by engaging and supporting parents and community organizations in their efforts to positively impact student learning and development.

(3) GRANT PROGRAM.—Contingent upon available funds, the center may facilitate the implementation of its community school

14 model in the state through grants that enable community  
15 organizations to establish long-term partnerships and secure  
16 resources for planning, staffing, and providing services to  
17 students and families through the community school model. The  
18 center shall:

19 (b) Prioritize awards based on demonstration of the  
20 technical and financial ability to sustain the community school  
21 model beyond an initial grant award. For planning grant awards,  
22 priority must be given to school districts in which the  
23 community school model has not been established and which  
24 demonstrate the technical and financial ability to sustain the  
25 community school model or to school districts expanding a  
26 program based on the feeder pattern of an existing community  
27 school in the district.

28 (4) REPORTING.—Beginning with September 1, 2020, and  
29 annually thereafter, the center shall publish on its website  
30 information on each community organization receiving a grant  
31 from the center to implement the community school model. The  
32 department and participating school districts must annually  
33 provide data necessary for the center to conduct a thorough  
34 evaluation of the model. The information must include:

35 (a) The amount of grant funds provided through the center  
36 for each participating school and the amount of matching funds  
37 provided by the community organization for each year the  
38 community organization has received a grant for that school.

40 memorandum of understanding for implementing the community  
41 school model pursuant to paragraph (2) (c).

42 (c) A description of the services and community engagement  
43 activities provided through the community school model.

44 (d) The number of students, families, and community  
45 members served through the community school model.

46 (e) The academic progress of students enrolled at the  
47 public school and students participating in services at the  
48 public school, including student progression data, attendance,  
49 behavior, and student achievement and learning gains on  
50 statewide, standardized assessments as determined pursuant to s.  
51 1008.34.

52 (f) Academic progress data of schools identified by the  
53 center as comparison sites for evaluation purposes.
