## **I.Amendments Contained in Message:**

**House Amendment – 855607 to Senate Amendment – 463652** (body with title)

## **II.Summary of Amendments Contained in Message:**

**House Amendment** – **855607** The House Amendment to the Senate Amendment:

- 1) Limits scope of amendment to victims of sexual offenses under 16 YOA (Senate is 18 YOA) Does NOT include any victim who has an intellectual disability (as in Senate amendment).
- 2) Does not require the defendant to file a written motion before a deposition can be taken, and does not provide that the court find good cause.
- 3) Court may set conditions, limitations, if court allows deposition of victim under 16 (in written order).
  - Not addressed in Senate amendment.
- 4) Creates presumption that deposition of child victim of sexual offense (under 12) is not appropriate IF
  - State has not filed Notice of Intent to seek death penalty AND a forensic interview is not available to defendant. Not addressed in Senate amendment.
